State of Georgia: April the 5<sup>th</sup> 1857  
Lee County: On the mentioned day Elbert Heislar  
being [www.georgiapioneers.com](http://www.georgiapioneers.com)

asked that Jonathan  
Davis, of the above named State and County,  
should be called to his bed-side, where he first  
asked Jonathan Davis to pray for him, after prayer  
E. Heislar expressed his belief in the Lord Jesus  
Christ and readiness and willingness to die. He  
then called the attention of his Mother, Green B.  
Mayo, his Brother David Heislar, Mrs. Holden a  
number of others to his wish and Will, viz:-  
That Jonathan Davis to take charge of his prop-  
erty, negroes and other things, and sell and pay all  
his just debts; also that Jonathan Davis  
should take his son John E. Heislar and raise  
and educate him with whatever means of his  
that should be left after paying his just debts,  
also stated that his negroes were and had  
been for some time at Samuel Lindsey's, that  
up to the present year 1857. Lindsey was to  
pay him Four Hundred Dollars a year for them  
and that the present year he and Lindsey were  
partnering together; all this being said and done

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> = My Will and desire is, first, that all my just debts be fully paid off and discharged by my Executors hereinafter appointed, -  
Item 3<sup>rd</sup> = I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter, Lucinda Hayship, five negroes, to-wit: - Phillis
