- Will of Elizabeth P. Forrester. -

Georgia In the Hon. C. W. Edwards, Ordaining Said State and County Lee County Being of Sound and disposing Mind and Memory do make this my last will and testament, I desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner.

Item Second I give, bequeath and devise to my Daughter Sarah J. Forrester the full sum of Two Hundred (200) Dollars, also my Bed and Wash Stand, and Lamp and Rocking Chair, and Bowl & Pitcher and pair of andirons, all of which are now in my room and owned by me. Item the third, To my Daughter

D. A. Odum, wife of Henry C. Odum, I give, bequeath and devise the full sum of Two Hundred (200) Dollars and all my household and kitchen furniture, except that bequeathed to Sarah Ann Jackson -

Item fourth - I give, bequeath and devise to my son John H. Forrester the sum of Two Hundred (200) Dollars

Item fifth - To my son R. V. Forrester I give, bequeath and devise the sum of Two Hundred (200) Dollars

Item sixth - To my son R. A. Forrester, I give, bequeath and devise the sum of Two Hundred (200) Dollars, also the Pictures of myself and husband now hanging in my room -

Item seventh - And to my Grand son R. D. Patterson son of Dr. J. D. Patterson, I give bequeath and devise the sum of Two Hundred (200) Dollars

Item Eighth - To my Old House Servant Lucy Thornton I give and bequeath all of my personal property

Clothes, All of said foregoing legacies I request my Executor (hereinafter named and appointed) to pay at as early a date as possible after my death - *Stew Ninth,*

After the payment of my just debts (including burial expenses and Physicians bill in my last illness) and all of the legacies mentioned in this my last will and testament, then the residue of my Estate both real and personal, I give bequeath and devise to my daughter in Law Martha J. Horrester (Wife of J. R. Horrester) without Charge or limitation whatever, to her own proper use benefit and behoof - *Stew Tenth,* I hereby constitute and appoint my son J. R. Horrester Executor of this my last Will and testament, This the 22nd day of June 1883.

I, A. T. Paul, John Perry, Lee County, and Jane Badden, were present on the month of October in the year (1894) one Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-four, at the house of Mrs. Pamela L. Bryan, a short time before her death, the said Mrs. Pamela L. Bryan being in the full & perfect possession of her mental faculties and of sound and disposing mind did call upon us to take notice & remember what she was about to say, and did in our presence Will and desire to dispose of all her worldly possessions in the manner and form following, To wit:—

Item 1st The Willers and desired that all her just debts should be paid.

Item 2nd The Willers & desired that all of her property both Real and personal be given to the children of her son H. E. Bryan in fee simple except as follows: That her husband M. H. Bryan was to have the control & use of said property for and during his natural life. That at the death of M. H. Bryan, said
