 After the payment of my just debts (including burial expenses and physician's bill in my last illness,) and all of the legacies mentioned in this my last will and testamento, then the residue of my estate both real and personal, I give bequests and devise to my daughter in law Martha A. Horrestor (wife of J.R. Horrestor) without charge or limitation whatsoever, to her own proper use benefit and behoof - Item Tenth, I hereby constitute and appoint my son J.R. Horrestor Executor of this my last will and testament, This the 22nd day of June 1883.

Municipal Will of Parmelia C. Bryan, Deed

State of Georgia ^{Lee County Wills} A. S. Paul, John Perry,
Lee County 1854-1891 and Jane Redden, were
present in the month of October
in the year (1894) one thousand eight hundred
and Ninety-four, at the house of Mrs.
Parmelia C. Bryan, a short time before her
death, the said Mrs. Parmelia C. Bryan being in
the full & perfect possession of her men-
tal faculties and of sound and disposing mind
did call upon us to take notice & remem-
ber what she was about to say and did in
our presence Will and desire to dispose of
all her worldly possessions in the manner
and form following, to wit:-

Item 1st She willed and desired that all her just
debts should be paid.

Item 2nd She willed & desired that all of her property
both real and personal be given to the
children of her son H. E. Bryan in fee sim-
ple except as follows, that her husband M. H.
Bryan was to have the control & use of said
property, for and during his natural life.
