

Will of Enoch Johnson.

Georgia In the name of God, Amen. I, Enoch Johnson,
 Lee County of the County's State aforesaid, knowing that I
 must shortly depart this life, deem it right and
 proper, both as respects my family and myself, that
 I should make a disposition of the property with
 which a kind Providence has blessed me, do therefore
 for make this my Last Will and Testament, hereby
 revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item First - I desire and direct that my body be buried in a
 decent and Christianlike manner suitable to
 my circumstances in life.

Item Second - I desire and direct that all my just debts be
 paid without delay by my Executor herein after appointed.

Item Third - I will and direct that my beloved children, S.
 Sarah Johnson and Francis Sepher Johnson shall remain
 with my beloved wife Delphina Elizabeth Johnson, at
 my place of residence subject to the power of dispo-
 sition by my 1854-1861 hereinafter to be mentioned, a
 stock my said children shall have a good Education.

Item Fourth - I will and direct that John Rabow Price, the son
 of my beloved wife shall remain with her at my
 residence, free from charge for Board, and that he
 shall receive two years Education and Board and
 ordinary Clothing until he shall arrive at the age
 of Twenty One years, at the charge of my Estate.

Item Fifth - I will and bequeath to my beloved son Enoch
 Johnson one negro man name George, and Rose a
 woman slave, and one negro man name Charles, &
 one negro woman name Maria, and the increase
 of said slaves to be delivered to him when he
 arrives at the age of Twenty One years and to
 remain until that time with my Estate free
 from any charge for hire and services of said slaves.

Item Sixth - I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Delphina
 Elizabeth Johnson the sum of Three Thousand Three
 Hundred Dollars to have and to hold during her
 natural life in the stead and in lieu of ~~time~~
 the same to revert back to my Estate at her death
 intermarriage diminished, and I also will an-

bequeath to my said wife in fee simple during her natural life or widowhood a full and complete Maintenance & support suitable to my Circumstances in life - Item Seventh - I will and direct that my Executors herein after named shall make and execute unto Eliza of Heister good & sufficient titles in fee simple to the half of the land wherein the said Heister now lives in the Thirteenth District of said County, at the expiration of two years from this time, provided said Heister shall pay by that time the entire amount now due for said land and satisfy my said thereafter named Executors of such payment -

Item Eighth - I will, and desire bequeath that all the residue of my property, both Real & personal wherein and whatever it may be including that given to my beloved wife Elizabeth, during her natural life or widowhood (after her estate therein is determined,) to my said children Sarah Ann, Emma Fannell, Mary Ann Delores & Frances Beepster, to be divided to them by shares as they respectively arrive at the age of majority one year or more -

Item Ninth - I direct and authorize my Executors herein after named to sell & dispose of all my Real estate either at public or private sale as to them may seem best for the purpose aforesaid whenever they may deem it proper and necessary to do so, and for the benefit of my Estate -

Item Tenth - I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth and my beloved friend Horace H. Woody, and my beloved Brother David Johnson Executors & Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament - This 14th day of December 1854, -

Will of Enoch Heisler, Decd.

State of Georgia Apr Lee County Wills 1857

Lee County, On 1854-1891 mentioned day, Enoch Heisler
being at his bed side, when he first

asked Jonathan Davis, of the above named State and County,
should be called to his bedside, when he first
asked Jonathan Davis to pray for him, after prayer
E. Heisler expressed his belief in the Lord Jesus
Christ and readiness and willingness to die, he
then called the attention of his mother, Asen B.
Mayo, his brother David Heisler, Mrs. Holden & a
number of others to his wish and Will, viz:-
That Jonathan Davis to take charge of his prop-
erty negroes and other things, and sell and pay all
his just debts; also that Jonathan Davis
should take his son John E. Heisler and raise
and educate him with whatever means of his
start should be left after paying his just debts,
also stated that his negroes were and had
been for some time at Samuel Lindsey's, then
up to the present year 1857, Lindsey was to
pay him Four Hundred Dollars a year for them
and that the present year he and Lindsey were
farming together; all this being said and done
