

Will of Enoch Johnson.

Georgia In the name of God, Amen. I, Enoch Johnson, of the County of Lee, State aforesaid, knowing that I must shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper, both as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, do therefore make this my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item First - I desire and direct, that, my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner, suitable to my circumstances in life -

Item Second - I desire and direct, that, all my just debts be paid, without delay, by my Executors hereinafter appointed.

Item Third - I will and direct, that, my beloved children, Sarah Johnson and Francis Senter Johnson, shall remain with my beloved wife Delphia Elizabeth Johnson, at my place of residence, subject to the power of disposition by my ^{Lee County Wills} ¹⁸⁵⁴⁻¹⁸⁹¹ ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} hereinafter to be mentioned, and that my said children shall have a good Education.

Item Fourth - I will and direct, that, John Robert Price, the son of my beloved wife shall remain with her at my Residence, free from charge for Board, and that he shall receive two years Education and Board and ordinary clothing until he shall arrive at the age of Twenty One years, at the charge of my Estate.

Item Fifth - I will and bequeath to my beloved son Enoch Johnson, one negro man name George, and Rose a woman slave, and one negro man name Charles, and one negro woman name Mariah, and the increase of said slaves to be delivered to him when he arrives at the age of Twenty One years, and to remain until that time with my Estate free from any charge for hire and services of said slaves.

Item Sixth - I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Delphia Elizabeth Johnson, the sum of Three Thousand, Three Hundred Dollars to have and to hold during her natural life, in the said and in lieu of dower the same to revert back to my Estate at her death, intermarriage undiminished, and I also will and

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bequeath to my said Wife in fee simple during her natural life or widowhood a full and complete maintenance & support suitable to my circumstances in life - Item Seventh - I will and direct that my Executors hereinafter named shall make and execute unto Elbert Heider good & sufficient title in fee simple to the half Tract of land whereon the said Heider now lives in the Thirtieth District of said County, at the expiration of two years from this time, provided said Heider shall pay by that time the entire amount now due for said land and satisfy my said hereinafter named Executors of such payment -

Item Eighth - I will, and direct & bequeath that all the residue of my property, both Real & personal wherever and whatever it may be including that given to my beloved daughter Delphia Elizabeth, during her natural life or widowhood (after her estate therein is determined) to my said Children Sarah Ann, Emma Samuel, Mary Ann Belovine & Frances Serepter, to be delivered to them by shares as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one year or marry -

Item Ninth - I direct and authorize my Executors hereinafter named to sell & dispose of all my Real estate either at public or private sale as to them may seem best for the purpose aforesaid whenever they may deem it proper and necessary to do so, and for the benefit of my Estate -

Item Tenth - I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Delphia Elizabeth and my beloved friend Thomas H. Moody, and my beloved Brother David F. Johns Executors & Administrators of this my Last Will and Testament - This 14th day of December 1854,

being and the said day Elbert Heislar
being and the said day Elbert Heislar
Davis, of the above named State and County
should be called to his bedside, when he first
asked Jonathan Davis to pray for him, after prayer
E. Heislar expressed his belief in the Lord Jesus
Christ and readiness and willingness to die. He
then called the attention of his Mother, Green B.
Mayo, his Brother David Heislar, Mrs. Holden and
number of others to his wish and Will, viz:-
That Jonathan Davis to take charge of his prop-
erty, negroes and other things, and sell and pay all
his just debts; also that Jonathan Davis
should take his son John E. Heislar and raise
and educate him with whatever means of his
that should be left after paying his just debts,
also stated that his negroes were and had
been for some time at Samuel Lindsey's, that
up to the present year 1857, Lindsey was to
pay him Four Hundred Dollars a year for them
and that the present year he and Lindsey were
partnering together; all this being said and done
