Lee County, Georgia, Fannie M. Chapman being partie
to this will and testamant, hereby revoking all
other wills heretofore made by me—

Item 1st—This is my wish that all the property which I
received from my deceased Husband, and now
in my hands, the same consisting of four
negroes, a House and Lot and some notes in
the name of Samuel Chapman, all being in
Telleforn County, shall be equally divided
between the Brothers and Sisters of my de-
ceased Husband William C. Chapman, in-
cluding a half sister Mrs. M. A. Chapman,

Item 2nd—I have three negroes—Bess, John and Reason,
Received through my Father, I direct that
they shall be sold by my Executor, and the
proceeds equally divided between my two
half sisters Mrs. Martha R. Alexander, and
Mrs. Mary A. Nickolson, —

Item 3rd—The six negroes that I have this day received
under the Will of my Grand-Father John
Mercer, I wish to be sold by my Executor, and

one-third of the proceeds to be paid to my brother Leonidas Mercer, and one-third of the sum to be held by my Executor in trust for the two children of Jack Morell Mercer, deceased, the interest of which to be paid annually for the support and Education. The remaining third to be paid by his son, too to an association now in the process of organization, under the patronage of the Baptist Denomination of the State of Georgia, for the Education and Maintenance of orphans soldiers, which amount is to be paid to the proper officer when incorporated, —

Item 11th = All the balance of my property and money left after the payment of all just debts & expenses I wish to be appropriated by my Executor towards erecting a suitable monument to the memory

of my deceased Husband, & the proper burial of my wife Lee County Wills

Item 12th = I do hereby 1854 A.D. my friend William Monroe sole Executor of ~~my~~ Georgia Pioneers ~~probate~~ & Testimetic. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 29th December 1864. = Fannie M. Chapman, D.S.
