

## Will of Miss. Francis D. Lindsey, Deceased.

State of Georgia, I, Francis D. Lindsey, of said State, County  
County of Lee, (being of sound and disposing mind & memory)

do make this my Last Will and Testament,  
Item 1<sup>st</sup> = I desire that my body be buried in a decent  
and Christian-like manner, suitable to  
my circumstances in life -

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> = After the payment of all my just debts, includ-  
ing burial expenses, and such other debts as are  
incurred during my last illness; I give, be-  
queath and devise to my Nephew Fred H. Hesk,  
my Niece Maggie Hesk, and my friend Wm. A. H.  
C. Gore, and Mrs. E. J. Gore, Jane Welch, Dora, jointly,  
and share and share alike, all of the fol-  
lowing property to-wit: All my Household &  
Kitchen furniture, Jewellery, Silver Ware, and  
all my personal property, of whatever kind &  
description that I now own or may own at  
the date of my death; and also, all the following  
Real property, to-wit: All that tract or parcel of  
Land, situate in the Eleventh (11<sup>th</sup>) District of  
said County of Lee, being fifty acres more  
or less, and fully described in the deed executed  
by George H. H. H. to Samuel Lindsey, as  
Trustee for Mr. Francis D. Lindsey, on the death  
day of November 1866, said deed Recorded January  
27<sup>th</sup>, 1871, in Clerk's office Lee Superior Court,  
in Book "B", at Page Fifty (50), also a certain  
town Lot in the town of Leeburg, Ga. known  
in the plan and survey of said town, as town  
Lot number (54) fifty-four, containing one  
half-acre more or less, and on which is  
now situated the "Lindsey-Hotel", with all the  
rights and appurtenances thereto belonging,  
free from all charge or limitation whatever,  
to their own proper use, receipt and behoof.  
It being my intention and desire by this  
my Will to divide all my property, both  
Real and Personal, equally between my
