

Will of Henry McKenzie.

State of Georgia. In the name of God Amen, -
 Lee County, I, Henry McKenzie of said State and County,
 being of advanced age, and knowing that I must
 shortly depart from this world, deem it right
 and proper both as respects myself, and my family,
 that I should make a disposition of the prop-
 erty with which a kind Providence has blessed
 me, I therefore make this my Last Will and
 Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all
 others heretofore made by me -

Item First: I desire and direct that my body be buried
 in a decent and Christian-like manner suitable
 to my condition and circumstances; my soul I
 trust shall return to rest with God who gave
 it, as I hope for eternal salvation through the
 blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. -

Item Second: I desire and direct that all my just debts be
 paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter
 named, as ^{Lee County Wills} ¹⁸⁵⁴⁻¹⁸⁹¹ ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} my Creditors should
 be delayed of their rights, especially so there is
 no necessity for delay. -

Item Third: I desire and direct that the property of
 which I am now possessed, be kept and held
 together so far as it is practicable until
 my youngest daughter Martha Louisa shall
 have become Twenty-One years of age, and
 then be equally divided between each one
 of my Children, unless in the judgment of
 my Executors, it should become necessary
 for the property to be divided at an earlier
 period, to save the property from loss. -

Item Fourth: I constitute and appoint my beloved daughter
 Eleanor, Executor, to this my Last Will and
 Testament, and desire and request my worthy
 friend William Hootis to advise & counsel
 her as to the best plan of managing the
 property. But in case my daughter Eleanor
 should marry a man who should prove to
 be incapable of managing the property

save it from loss, or should be guilty of wasting it in any way, I desire and direct that the management of it be taken care of by or for the heirs, & that my worthy friend William Stokes, shall proceed to act, on my Executors, with full power to carry out the conditions of this my Last Will and Testament. —

Item fifth: I desire & direct, that my younger Children shall receive such an Education as can be given them under the circumstances. —
