Georgia, To the Ordinary of said County, --
 I, Lee County, the petitioner of Georgia A. Whitaker, respectfully
 sheweth that herebefore, to-wit: on the 1st day of January
 1877, Hudson Whitaker, of said State and County,
 departed this life in said County Testate, having
 before said time, on the 25th day of December 1876,

 G. W. Warwick, made his Last Will and Testament,

 aforesaid, being of sound mind and disposing
 memory, knowing the uncertainty of life, and
 the certainty of death, and desiring to do it in

a Christian's duty to make a proper disposition
of all my earthly possessions, as I leave this
earthly home for a heavenly mansion, do make
and declare this my Last Will & Testament,
thus revoking any and all Wills heretofore by
me made. I therefore Will and declare,

First. = That any Body be rewarded a decent and Christian-like funeral, and my soul to my God, as I hope for immortality through the merits of my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. --

Second. = I will and desire that my Executors hereinafter to be appointed, shall pay all my just debts, --

Third. = I will and desire that the money arising from my "Life Insurance Policy" be collected, and the same divided as follows, the third to be paid to my beloved wife Georgia A. Whitaker, the third of the remainder to my beloved daughter Mary Ellison, wife of Robert D. Ellison, and the remainder to Beatra Whitaker, for the use of my Grand-Son Hudson Whitaker, --

Fourth. = I further will and desire that my plantation in Terrell County, Georgia, with all the stock of mules, plantation tools, wagons, teams, cotton-seed, fodder, and other property on said place, with my dwelling house, in the town of Smithville, Terrell County, with all my property, thereunto attached, horses, mafy, cattle, hogs, household and kitchen furniture, be bequeathed to my beloved wife Georgia A. Whitaker, for and during her life or widowhood, she to have the use and enjoyment of the same, with all the rents, profits or issues, that may arise therefrom, with power to sell or exchange any of the personal property, having in view the interest of the plantation; with the confident hope that she will aid and assist my daughter Mary Ellison, and my Grand-Son Hudson Whitaker through his mother or otherwise, --

Fifth. = It is my further will and desire, that in the event my wife should marry, then all the property, to be divided by date, or his widow, in the following year,

Ypostions; my wife to have one third, my daughter Mary Ellison, Two-Thirds of the remainder, and my Grand-Son Hudson Whitaker, the remainder. But, in the event of the death of my beloved wife before marriage, that the property be divided by sale or in kind, as follows: my daughter Mary Ellison, to have Two-Thirds of the whole Estate, and her & son Whitaker, for the sole use of my grand-Son Hudson Whitaker, the remainder. --

sixth. = It is my further will that my beloved wife, shall have authority to sell at private sale my undivided half interest in the Store-House & Lot of Allen & Whitaker, in Smithville, in her discretion, and the proceeds divided in the same Ratio, as I have fixed in this Will. --

seventh. = Having theutmost confidence in my beloved wife Georgia A. Whitaker, I hereby constitute her by these presents my Executor to carry out this my last will and Testament, thus revoking all appointments heretofore by me made, and, amending and re-voking all Wills by me made before this date. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal, this the Twenty-fifth day of December 1876. --
