It is my wish and desire that my son Leonard E. Mercer, shall take charge of, avowed and faithful family servant, named Phillis, and provide for her comfortable maintenance during life as a member of the household, Item Second, = It is my

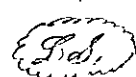
Will and desire that my Executor hereinafter appointed shall sell all my Estate, both Real

and Personal, (Except the negroes which are to be divided as hereinafter stated, and also except the negro woman Phillis as hereinbefore provided for. —

Item 3rd It is my Will and desire that all my property be with the money arising from the sale of my property, as above stated, as well as my negroes be divided into three equal shares, one share to vest in my Son Leonides, D. Mercer, One share to my daughter Fannie H. Chapman, and the remaining share to go to Julia Anne, the Children of my deceased Son Joel Derrell Mercer, to be held by said Executor until a Guardian shall be appointed for my said Grand Children, then to be turned over to such Guardian, and until such appointment is made, such portion of the income of their share as may be necessary for their support and education may be paid only by my said Executor, and in the event of the death of either of said Children before their marriage, or coming of age, then the same to go to the survivor, and in the event of the death of both before their marriage or coming of age, then their share to revert back to my Estate and be divided as hereinbefore provided for. =

Item 4th = I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son Leonides D. Mercer, and my daughter Fannie H. Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand, this the 25th day of November 1864.

Item 2nd I have three negroes, Ben, John and Reason, received through my father, I direct that they shall be sold by my Executor, and the proceeds equally divided between my two half Sisters Mrs. Martha R. Alexander, and Mrs. Mary A. Nickolson, -

Item 3rd The six negroes that I have this day received under the Will of my Grand Father John Mercer, I wish to be sold by my Executor, and
