Will of Jonas Hayslip, Deceased.

Georgia: In the name of God, Amen.

Lee County: Know all men by these presents, That J. Jonas Hayslip, of the County & State aforesaid being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, knowing that it is appointed unto men once to die, and looking forward to that event do make and declare this my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills made or intended into -

Item 1st - I give my Soul to God who gave it, my body to the grave to be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner. -

Item 2nd - My Will and desire is, first, That all my just debts be fully paid off and discharged by my Executors hereinafter appointed. -

Item 3rd - I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Lavinia Hayslip, five negroes, to-wit: Phillis

11th Item, John's estate to be held in trust by my
 beloved friend William N. Green, for the use of my
 said daughter and the heirs of her body, and at
 her death to divide the same among the heirs of
 her body the same never to be subject to any
 debts or contracts of her present or any future
 husband, but to be held and kept for the sole
 benefit of my said daughter Lucinda, and her
 heirs. Item 12th My last will and desire is,
 that all my other property, except the negroes
 heretofore given shall be equally divided between
 my beloved wife Elizabeth Hayslip, my son Benja-
 min Hayslip, my daughter Sarah Hayslip, and
 my daughter Winniford Hayslip, except a little
 negro girl Harriet which I desire that my young-
 est daughter Winniford to have extra and above
 the share of my other heirs above named. My
 further will and desire is that a division of the
 above estate shall not take place until my son
 Benjamin becomes of age, or one of my daughters,
 Sarah or Winniford marries, or at the death of
 my wife Elizabeth, and in the event that my wife
 Elizabeth should die before either my son Benja-
 min arrives of age, or either of my daughters
 marries so as to bring about the above contin-
 gented division, then all my estate, both real
 and personal, except the five negroes heretofore
 given to my daughter Lucinda, and the
 negro Harriet given extra to my daughter
 Winniford, shall be equally divided between
 my son Benjamin & my daughters Sarah & Winniford.
 Item 13th My will and desire is that the portion of
 property inherited from my said estate by my
 daughters Sarah & Winniford shall be held &
 remain the sole and separate property of them-
 selves and their heirs and not subject to the sole
 debts or contracts of their husbands, should they ever marry.
 Item 14th My further will and desire is, that my wife
 Elizabeth, shall have, use and control my entire
