Will of Joseph Jordan, deceased.

Georgia. In the name of God, amen.

I, Joseph Jordan, of said State and County, being of advanced age, and knowing, that I must shortly depart from this World, being of sound memory and mind deem it right & proper, both as respects me and my family, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me. I therefore make this my Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others made by me.

Item 1st - I desire that after my death my body be buried in a Christianlike manner suitable to my condition and circumstances.

Item 2nd - I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors or

Administrators hereinafter made and appointed.

Item 3rd = I will and bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Jordan one negro woman, named Hannah about twenty six years of age, and a little negro boy named Tom about two years old, the son of the said negro woman Hannah, during the term of her natural life, and at her death the said negro woman Hannah and her child Tom to be given to my youngest son David Alexander Jordan. —

Item 4th = I will and bequeath to my son Enoch Jordan Lot of land Number Two Hundred and Twenty five in the 13th District, except Twenty acres sold off said Lot to R. S. Williams, one negro man named Jerry and one gray Mule age 4 years. —

Item 5th = I give and bequeath to my son Randal Jordan Lot of land Number Two Hundred and Nine (209) in the 11th District in said County, and one negro man by the name of Dick, and one black Mule Pink. —

Item 6th = I give and bequeath to my son Moses Jordan One Lot of land Number Seven in the 11th District of said County, and one negro man by the name of Bill, and one black Mule (female) name Rollie. —

Item 7th = I will & bequeath to my son David Alexander Jordan, one lot of Land Number Two Hundred & forty, in the 11th District of County & State aforesaid, and one negro by the name of Leindy, also the year cotton gin, one sorrel horse with saddle.

Item 8th = I give and bequeath to my daughter Matilda Sanders, one lot of Land Two Hundred and fourteen, in the 11th District of Baker County, one negro woman by the name of Rose forty-five or fifty years old, also one sorrel horse colt, also one infant child Victoria, the mother of said infant is Monning, it being her first born, also all demands that I hold against Joseph Pauls. —

Item 9th = I give and bequeath to my daughter Emmeline Mashburn one Lot of Land Number ninety-five in the Eleventh District of Baker County and State aforesaid, also one negro woman by the name of

knowing about 17 years of age, also one Execution
Thomas Martin against David Mashburn, for
thirty dollars principal, obtained in Justice Court,
also one note made by David Mashburn of fifteen
dollars - Item 10th = I give and bequeath to my
daughter Lodovick Jordani one fraction of Land
number Two Hundred and Twenty-four, in the
thirteenth district of said County, one negro
owned by the name of Leathair, about seven
or eighteen years of age, also one boy more, -

Item 11th = I give and bequeath to my son Randall Jordani
for the use of and in trust for my daughter Sarah
Ann Martin, wife of Thomas Martin, one Lot
of Land number One Hundred and forty-five
in the twelfth district of said County, the land
whereon Thomas Martin now lives, also seven
head of stock, and the property mentioned in
this Item 11th shall be held by my son Randall Jordani
for the sole use of said son, and in trust for
my said daughter Sarah Ann, and the heirs of
her body, and not to be subject to the possession or
control of the said Thomas Martin, -

Item 12th = I direct that the rest of my property not other-
wise disposed of by this my Last Will (wary
wordy and notes and excepted) of what kind so
ever whether Real or Personal after my death
to be sold & divided among my heirs equally.

Item 13th = I do constitute and appoint my beloved wife
Mary Jordani and my son Randall Jordani Executors
to this my Last Will and Testament -

Georgia: I, J. Joseph Jordan, of County and State aforesaid,
 do hereby certify after due reflection & mature consideration have
 come to the conclusion to change one item in the
 above Will, which is the Eighth, in relation to Joseph
 Sauls' legacy. In the said Sauls being very much
 dissatisfied with the aforesaid Will in consequence
 of my not having given him a greater share, and
 having otherwise acted very improperly & unbecom-
 ingly. I have concluded to diminish his portion of
 legacy, and do hereby revoke and set aside every
 clause and item in relation to his bequest, and in-
 stead thereof give him the just sum of Fifty Dollars,
 to be paid him by my Executors after my death,
 also I give him seven head of cattle, and seven
 head of Hogs, which he has at this time, or should
 have, if he has not sold them in his possession,
 do further supplement this supplement to the aforesaid
 will, do hereby give him and disinherish him, the said Joseph Sauls or his rep-
 resentatives from having any further interest in
 my Estate. Real and Personal after my death.
