considerable Estate, a Will which is here to the

silver ware, consisting of teapots and spoons,
of Will and I bequeath to my beloved husband
Andrew J. Miller, my gold watch for and
during his natural life, and then to my
daughter Julia Eppie Miller, --
4th - It is my further Will that my Real Estate
consisting of lots of lands above, 123, 124, 125 & 126

in 13th District of said County, and my said
property in the Town of Smithville, in said County,
shall belong jointly to my Husband Andrew J.
Miller, and my daughter Julia Eppie Miller,
One-Half ($\frac{1}{2}$) to said Daughter in fee simple, the
other ($\frac{1}{2}$) one-half, to said Andrew J. Miller, for
and during his Natural life, and after his
death to revert to my said Daughter Julia Eppie
Miller. - (5th) It is my further Will and
desire that if my said Daughter should die
without Children then her interest in my Estate
to go to my Husband, if in life, but if he
should not survive my Daughter, and she should
die without leaving Children or representatives
of children, then her interest in my Estate
be equally divided, one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) to the family of
my beloved Father W. W. McCafee, and the other
half to the Lee County Wives of my said Husband, ac-
cording to the 1854-1881 of distribution of this State. -

6th It is my further Will and desire that all the
property I have given to my said daughter Julia Eppie
Miller shall belong to her any Children she may have
free from any debt or control of any Husband she may have
by the 7th It is my further Will & desire that my beloved Husband
Andrew J. Miller, be & is hereby appointed Executor to comp-
out the requests in this Will, & also to act as Successor
ary Guardian of the said Julia Eppie Miller, until she
marries or becomes of age. In testimony whereof I have
set my hand & seal, this the 29th day of December
