Georgia, In the Lee County Wills Book, Ordinary of said County, 1854-1891, the petition of Andrew J. Miller of said County, respectfully sheweth that heretofore to-wit: on the 5th day of January 1880, viz: Julia M. Miller, wife of petitioner died in said County, leaving considerable Estate, a Will which is here to the Court shewn, and by the terms of said Will your petitioner was appointed Executor of her Last Will and Testament; Petitioner also tenders said Will for Probate in Common-Form of Law, and petitioner further shews that the same was witnessed by W. M. McAfie, M. D. Sanders, and C. W. Harwick; He therefore brings C. W. Harwick, one of said Witnesses, who being duly sworn says that he saw Julia M. Miller, Testatrix, sign the paper attached, (or deliver it to --) and declare it to be her Last Will and Testament; That he saw W. M. McAfie and M. D. 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State of Georgia, In the name of God, Amen. --

Lee County, I, Julia M. Miller, wife of Andrew J. Miller of said State and County being of sound mind and disposing memory, but feeling that sooner or later I must die, desire to make this my Last Will and Testament. -- 1. I desire that my body be buried in a decent manner, and my soul I bequeath to my God, who gave it, as I hope for Salvation through the merits of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. 2. I bequeath to my beloved daughter Julia Eppie Miller, my Silver-Ware, consisting of cups and spoons. 3rd I will and bequeath to my beloved husband Andrew J. Miller, my Gold Watch for and during his natural life, and then to my daughter Julia Eppie Miller. -- 4th It is my further Will that my Real Estate, consisting of Lots of Land Nos. 123, 124, 125, 126, &c.

in 13th District of said County, and my Town property in the Town of Smithville, in said County, shall belong jointly to my Husband Andrew J. Miller, and my daughter Julia Eppie Miller, One-Half ($\frac{1}{2}$) to said Daughter in fee simple, the other ($\frac{1}{2}$) one-Half, to said Andrew J. Miller, for and during his natural life, and after his death to Revert to my said Daughter Julia Eppie Miller. - (5th) It is my further Will and desire that if my said Daughter should die without children then her interest in my Estate to go to my Husband, if in life, but if he should not survive my Daughter, and she should die without leaving children or Representatives of children then her interest in my Estate to be equally divided, one-Half ($\frac{1}{2}$) to the family of my beloved Father Wm. Meafe, and the other half to the heirs at law of my said Husband, according to the laws of distribution of this State. -

6th " It is my further Will and desire that all the property I've given to my said daughter Julia Eppie Miller shall belong to her and any children she may have free from any debts or control of any Husband she may have. -
7th " It is my further Will & desire that my beloved Husband Andrew J. Miller, be & is hereby appointed Executor to carry out the bequests in this Will, & also to act as Testamentary Guardian of the said Julia Eppie Miller, until she marries or becomes of age. In testimony whereof I have set my hand & seal, this the 29th day of December 1878. -
