

## Will of Mary A. Green. —

- Georgia In the name of God, Amen. —  
 Lee County, I, Mary A. Green, of said County, being of  
 abundance of mind and sound and disposing memory  
 and knowing that I must shortly die & depart  
 this life, and desire it right and proper, both  
 as regards myself and family that I should  
 make a disposition of the property with  
 which a kind Providence has blessed me  
 with, I do therefore make this my Last Will  
 and Testament, revoking and annulling all  
 others by me heretofore made, revoking always  
 the one made by me a few days ago, because  
 that it does not make a disposition of all of my property.
- 1<sup>st</sup> = I will and direct that my body be buried in  
 a Christian-like manner in accordance with  
 my means in life, and that my soul return  
 to God, who gave it. —
- 2<sup>nd</sup> = I will and direct that all my just debts

- 3<sup>rd</sup> = I give to my beloved Step-Son William R. Green,  
 all my land and my house, on which I now live,  
 number two hundred and sixteen as the land  
 drawn by me from the Estate of Thomas Green,  
 deceased, containing two hundred acres more or  
 less. I also give to the said William all  
 of my Bank-Stock. —
- 4<sup>th</sup> = I give to Martha J. Fleming one hundred dol-  
 lars in Gold. —
- 5<sup>th</sup> = I give to Mary Ida Harris one hundred and fifty dollars in Gold.
- 6<sup>th</sup> = I give to my dear Step-Son John M. D. Green one  
 hundred dollars and my dear Step-daughter  
 Sarah A. H. H. one hundred dollars, also to  
 my dear Step-daughter Lovey E. H. H., one  
 hundred dollars. —
- 7<sup>th</sup> = I give to the Grand-daughters of Thomas Green,  
 deceased, which Grand-daughters are this day  
 living, there being fourteen of them, the sum  
 of twenty-five (25) dollars each, and in case

of said Grand Daughter of said should die before they receive the Twenty-five dollars of said the sister of the said Deceased Grand-child shall inherit the said Twenty-five Dollars, where share alike, would name said Grand-Daughter, but would make this Will too long.

8<sup>th</sup> = I give to my old servant Madison Jullie, one sixth the undivided Tenth of the Estate of Thomas Green, Decd. I also give to his wife Harriet Jullie everything now in my possession, 9<sup>th</sup> = I give to my dear & beloved Step-Son William A. Green all of my Household and Kitchen furniture, and all of my perishable property, not heretofore given away and I give to the said William A. - all the residue of my property, not before given away by me.

10<sup>th</sup> = I will and direct that my dear Step-Son William A. Green, be & is hereby appointed by me my Executor of my Last Will and Testament, this March 9<sup>th</sup> 1882. Mary A. Green.
