

Will of Mrs. Indiana Fletcher,

In the name of God, Amen.

I, Indiana Fletcher of the County of Lee
and State of Georgia, being of sound and dis-
posing mind and memory, and being desirous
to settle my worldly affairs, while I have
strength so to do, do make and publish this
my Day of Will and Testament, hereby revoking
all Wills by me at any time here before made,
and first, I commit my soul to God, who gave it, and
my Body I desire to be buried in the family
burial ground in Sumter County of this State,
at the place where my husband John M. Fletcher,
was buried.

- 1st = I desire to be buried in a plain and decent
manner, and I further desire that my own
and that of my Husband be enclosed, and
that the expenses thereof be paid out of my Estate,
- 2nd = I give to my daughter Martha E. Fletcher one

Wash-stand &c, Wash Bowl & Pilettor, One
Kinned Bed Table, One Bed and Bed-Stead,

- 3rd = I give to my daughter Margaret G. Fletcher,
my Negroe girl Anna, about about twelve years old
and One Bed and Bed-Stead, and One
set, of Silver Tea Spoons, & one set of Table Spoons.
- 4th = I give to my son John G. Fletcher Three
Hundred Dollars.
- 5th = I give to my Son Mark H. Fletcher Four
Hundred Dollars.
- 6th = I desire that the balance of my Estate be
sold at my death and equally divided
between my minor Children, to wit:-
W. M. Fletcher, Marietta J. McConnel, James
H. Fletcher, Mark H. Fletcher, Margaret E.
Fletcher, and Margaret G. Fletcher.
- 7th = And I further desire that my Land be

Appraised by some disinterested persons, and that my daughter Mary Jr., can have it at the appraisement.

8th = It is my will and desire that Mr. J. Williams be and he is hereby appointed my Executor at my death, to take all my Estate into hand and dispose of it agreeable to my Will, - The Writings whereof is, the said Indiana Fletcher to this my will shall set my Seal and seal this the 11th day of November 1864,
