

Non-occupative will of Mrs. M. E. Laramore, Dec.

Wm. W. Bryan & P. L. Bryan, was present on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May 1889, at the residence of Mrs. M. E. Laramore, in Lee County during her last illness, before her death, which occurred on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May 1889, in her house in Lee County, she was in perfect possession of her mental faculties and appeared to me said M. E. Laramore called upon the by-standers & upon the undersigned especially, and in particular to remember and take notice of what she was about to say when she said: It had been her intention for some time passed to make her will in writing thereby to dispose of her property but had neglected to carry her intention into execution, and now it was not practicable she said that she wished me to understand that she revoked all other wills heretofore made or attempted to be made by her; And that her will and desire was that Georgia Holt, her daughter, Cow Laramore her daughter, John Lewis Prichet, her Grand-son, should have the Lot of Land on which her dwelling house is situated, and all of her personal property, except one mule, said Lot of land and said personal property to belong to the said Georgia Holt, Cow Laramore, John Lewis Prichet jointly, her will and desire was, that her son A. J. Laramore have one of her mules, and that the balance of her property, both Real & personal not given to Georgia Holt, Cow Laramore & John Lewis Prichet, be equally divided with William Laramore, Louis Laramore, A. J. Laramore her son, James H. Johnson her Grand-son, & Fannie Bowling, N. P. Chaetune, Callie G. Broadfield, her daughter, after all of her debts are paid her said debts to be paid out of the property not given to Georgia Holt, Cow Laramore & John Lewis Prichet, she desired and appoints Louis Laramore, Grand-son of Cow Laramore & John Lewis Prichet, to take charge of and control their property until they arrive at the age of twenty, and without
