Georgia. In the name of God, Amen, -
 Lee County, I, Maney G. Gardner, being of advanced age
 and knowing that I must shortly depart this
 life, do in right and proper form as respects my
 family and myself, that I should make a disposi-
 tion of my sole and separate Estate, with which
 a kind Providence has blessed me, and do there-
 fore make this my Last Will and Testament re-
 voking hereby all others heretofore made by me. -
 Item 1st: It is my Will and desire that my body should
 be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner
 suitable to my condition in life. -
 Item 2nd: It is my Will and desire that all my just
 debts should be paid by my Executor herein after
 named as soon as the same can be done after my death. -
 Item 3rd: I do hereby Will and devise and bequeath to my
 beloved son James Gardner (in as much as all
 my other children have been previously provided
 for) and in www.georgiapioneers.com said son James upon
 an equality with them, so far as I am able to do, the
 following property, to wit: Lot of land Number
 fourteen (14) in the 12th (12th) District of Lee
 County upon which I now live, together with
 the improvements thereon, one negro man
 named "Henry" of mulatta complexion, about
 twenty eight years old, one negro woman named
 below of black complexion, and about twenty five
 years old, and her two children, one named Fanny
 a girl about six years old, and one named Peter,
 a boy about two years old, and also one negro
 girl named Mary, of fair mulatta complex-
 ion, and about eight years old, and in the
 event of the death of my said son James
 leaving no child or children, at the time
 of his death, and in that case it is my desire
 that all the aforesaid property shall be di-
 vided between my children Mary Smith
 wife of Levi B. Smith, John M. S. Gullett,
 and George M. Gullett equally, share and

share alike. Item 4th It is my Will and desire that my Executor's herein after named in the week of my death before the present crops shall have been gathered and sold, shall dispose of the same together with my stock of cattle, Hogs, horses, for the payment of my debts and appropriate the money so raised to that purpose, & to divide the residue thereof if there should be any between John M. J. Gullett, George M. Gullett, Mary Suleith, wife of Levi B. Smith, and my husband James G. Gardner, equally.

Item 5th =

I do hereby give & bequeath all my bedding, and Bed furniture to George M. Gullett, and James Gardner my sons, and James G. Gardner my husband, to be equally divided between them.

Item 6th =

I do hereby appoint Joseph Poir of the County of Talbot as Trustee and Guardian of my said Son James, to control and manage the property hereby bequeathed to him until he shall have arrived the full age of twenty one years -

Item 7th =

I do hereby nominate and appoint my worthy and faithful friend Joseph Poir of the County of Talbot as Executor of this my last Will & Testament, November 16th 1858. = Nancy G. Gardner
