

Will of Wm M. McFee. —

State of Georgia. I, Wm M. McFee living of Adams County of Geo. — Age, and knowing I must shortly depart this life, and having a sound mind and disposing memory, I feel it to be a duty I owe to those I leave behind to make a disposition of the property that a kind Providence has entrusted to my care, —

First: It is my Will and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner, my Soul I commit to the care of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and I hope for salvation through His intercession with God the Father. —

Second: It is my Will and desire that after my death all my property of every description, Real Personal, Mises, Choses-in-action, & Money, shall go to my beloved wife Mary E. McFee, for ^{Lee County Wills} the term of her natural life, without account for collections, Rents, Issues or profits. ¹⁸⁵⁴⁻¹⁸⁹¹

Third: After the death of my beloved Wife, it is my Will and desire, the undivided half interest in the property known as the McFee House, situated in the town of Smithville, now leased to M. S. Deidrich, until the 1st day of Novr. 1884, with the lot on which it stands, with all the out buildings and stable lot, extending from the Rail-Road Right-of-Way, to the E. Deidrich's lot and from McFee street to the ditch between this lot and S. M. Johnson's Hotel-Lot, with the undivided half-interest in the lot's furniture, (except the prime, this belongs to my beloved wife) also the town lot lying on the east side of McFee street, and east of R. E. McFee's dwelling lot, extending east to lot No. One, and south to the dividing line between the garden lot and the new house lot, so descend in equal

ports to my children, viz: R. H. Robert E. Miller
H. & Fort W. McAfee and my daughter Mrs. Ella
C. Miller, as Beneficiaries in Common. -

Fourth: - It is my Will and desire that after the death
of my beloved wife that my plantation at and
near Adams Station with all the personal prop-
erty thereon shall descend to my Son Miller H.
& Fort W. McAfee.

Fifth: - It is my Will and desire that at the death of
my beloved wife the south-half of the Garden Lot
which is extended west to the ditch with the
dwelling house and out buildings thereon
shall descend in fee simple to my Son Fort W. McAfee.

Sixth: - The reason I have made no provision for
my Grand-Daughter, Effie Miller, is, I have hereto-
fore advanced more to her late mother than
I am able to give my other children. Now, in
order to carry out the several bequests in
this my last Will and Testament, I do hereby
constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary
E. McAfee, and my Son Robert E. McAfee, as my
Executors and Executors of this Will, hereby
revoking all other Wills heretofore by me made.
In testimony whereof I have hereto set my
hand and affixed my seal, this the 3rd day
