

Will of R. E. McCafee.

State of Georgia - I, William R. McCafee being of sound mind and County of Lee. - Age, and knowing I must shortly depart

this life, and having a sound mind and disposing memory, I feel it to be a duty I owe to those I leave behind to make a disposition of the property that a kind Providence

has entrusted to my care, -

First. It is my will and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner, my soul I commit to the care of the Lord and savior Jesus Christ, as I hope for salvation through His intercession with God the Father, -

Second. It is my Will and desire that after my death all my property of every description, Real Personal, Misses-in-action, & Money, shall go to my beloved wife Mary E. McCafee, for Lee County, Wills by the time of her natural life, without account for collectors, Renters, lessees or grantees, -

Third. After the death of my beloved wife, it is my Will and desire, that an undivided half interest in the property known as the McCafee House, situated in the town of Milledgeville, now leased to Mr. S. D. Deidrich, until the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Nov. 1884, with the lot on which it stands, with all the out buildings and stable lot, extending from the Rail-Road Right-of-Way to Mr. D. Deidrich's Lot next from McCafee street to the ditch between this lot and S. M. Johnson's Hotel-Lot, with the undivided half-interest in the hotel furniture, (Except the piano, this belongs to my beloved wife,) also the town lot lying on the east side of McCafee street, and East of R. E. McCafee's dwelling lot, extending east to lot No. One, and south to the dividing line between the garden lot and the rear house lot, so divided in equal

feats to my children, viz: R. Robert E. Miller Jr., & Fort H. McCafe, and my daughter Mrs. Ella C. Miller, as Executors in Commission.

Fourth: - It is my Will and desire that after the death of my beloved wife that my plantation at and near Adams Station with all the personal property thereon shall descend to my son R. Miller Jr. & Fort H. McCafe.

Fifth: - It is my Will and desire that at the death of my beloved wife the south-half of the Meadow Lot which is extended west. to the ditch with the Dwelling House and out buildings thereon shall descend in fee simple to my son Fort H. McCafe.

Sixth: - The reasons wherefore I have made no provision for my Grand-Daughter, Effie Miller, is, I have heretofore advanced more to her late mother than I am able to give my other children. Now, in order to carry out several bequests in this my last Will and Testament, I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary E. McCafe, and my son R. Robert E. McCafe, my Executrix and Executor of this Will, hereby revoking all other Will's heretofore by me made.
