

Will of William F. Sadler, --

Georgia; In the name of God, Amen, --
 Lee County, 3d. William F. Sadler, of said County and State,
 being mindful of the uncertainty of life, and the
 certainty of death, and being of sound and disposing
 mind and Memory, do make, publish and declare
 this my Last Will and Testament, --

Item 1st = Relying confidently on the merits and atonements
 of my Savior, I commit my Soul to God, who gave
 it, and I direct that my Body after death, be
 decently buried in accordance with my circumstan-
 ces in life, -- Item 2nd, = I hereby direct that
 my present Crops of Cotton, and the Stock of Goods
 in the Store, on my Mill-place, be sold for the
 purpose of paying my just debts, & for the benefit
 of my wife and Children and Mother & devise
 that the Proceeds be so applied, and that the
 provision-Crops, & other Crops growing, other than
 Cotton Crops ~~be sold to Lee County Hills~~ supplement the money
 arising from the sale of the stock of Goods, in
 the Store & the Cotton Crop, in providing support
 for my said Wife and Children, & Mother, and in
 carrying on the business of their Farms herein
 after mentioned, --

Item 3rd, = I will and bequeath to my Daughter Emma Hale
 my Gold Watch, as her separate property, Likewise
 to my Son William Theophilus, I will and bequeath my
 Silver Watch to be his separate property, my Bay
 Mare, Maggie, & my Buggy. I will and bequeath to
 my beloved Wife and Children jointly, --

Item 4th, = My Mill-place containing about Six Hundred
 acres more or less, with the Stock House, and
 the Store-House, being property that came to
 me in right of my first wife, I will and
 bequeath to my five beloved Children, Emma
 Hale, William Theophilus, John Murdy, Fannie
 Gestader, & Anna Temple, to be enjoyed by them
 in common, share and share alike, Likewise
 my place with improvements and stock
 containing six hundred acres more or less,

I give and bequeath to my five Children, first named to-wit: Emma D. William Jr., John Mr., Fizzie G. and Anna J. Sadler, in common Share and share alike. This place is known as the "Pretty Ground" place, & comes to me also in right of my first Wives and being already due to my said Children, is named. There also, in the event the Recd above, should ever be deemed insufficient, to convey it absolutely to them. —

Item 5th— My Home-place, on which I now live, and the neighboring places, being all the land down, not hereinbefore devised, and containing, in all Seven hundred acres, more or less. Advert to be kept together, with Stock, implements & furniture, as a home for my Wife, Children & my Mother, all to be Equally interested therein while they enjoy it in Common. My Mother's interest to continue during her Natural life, & on her death, ^{Lee County Wills} ¹⁸⁵⁴⁻¹⁸⁹¹ www.georgiapioneers.com to rest in my before named Children. My Wife's interest to continue during her Widowhood as long as she remains unmarried, and a Step-Mother to my Children. The Children's interest to rest in them absolutely, and in fee simple. Bequeath my Estate in Epoch away in the lands of my late Father's Estate, and owned by my Mother during her lifetime remained over to me at her death. I will & bequeath to my said Wife and Children in the same manner and upon the same terms, as I do the Home-place just before named, that is to say, to be held and enjoyed by them in common, share & share alike. Wife's interest to cease only on her marriage or death, and the Children's interest to be absolute and in fee simple, —

Item 6th— Having full confidence in my beloved wife Mary Elizabeth Sadler, and my dear friend Dr. Jasper H. Smith, I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint them to be executors of this my last Will and Testament, and I do hereby make

Published yesterday the 21st of this month, do hereby
alter and amend my said Will as follows, to-wit: I
hereby direct that the interest given and devised and

hereby revoke, and every provision thereof counter-
