Georgia B. J. William Wells, of said State and County,
Lee County, being of sound & disposing mind and memory,
do make this my Last Will and Testament, -

Item First: I Will and direct that my Soul be returned
to God, when gave it, -

Item Second: I Will and direct that my body be buried in a
Christian-like manner in accordance with my means on
Third: - earth, - Item Third: I Will and direct

that my just debts be paid by my Executors hereinafter
named, as soon after my death as practicable,

Item Fourth: I give bequeath and devise to my dear by
beloved wife Sarah E. Wells, during her nat-
ural life or widow-hood all of my property, both
Real and personal, except that part which I have
disposed of by deed or gift; said property given
to my said wife only, to be subject to the support
of my said wife during her widow-hood.

Item Fifth: I will and direct that at the death or marriage
of my dear by beloved wife Sarah E. Wells, that
all of the property given to my said wife for and
during her natural life or widow-hood, be by
my Executors divided equally between my Children,
If any of my said Children shall be dead, then
the share of my said Children to inherit their
father's or mother's share of my said Estate, -

Item Sixth: I hereby constitute and appoint my dear by
beloved Sons W. D. Wells & J. L. Wells, Executors
of this my Last Will and Testament, - This
November 25th 1887, - William Wells, (S)
