

In the Name of god amen, I Ann May of the County of Liberty in the State of Georgia being weak in body but of a perfect memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and that it is appointed for all men once to die, I have made and ordained this my last Will and Testament, That is to say First of all I commend my Soul into the Hands of God that gave it, and my Body to the dust from whence it was taken, to be buried with Christian decency at the discretion of my Executors, and as to the worldly Estate with which it has pleased God to bless me, I think proper to dispose of in the following manner — I do promise, after all my lawful debts is discharged and a just Appraisement of my whole Estate is made, Item, — I give and bequeath unto my beloved Grand Children Audley, Hannah Rebecca Leiper and Joseph Maxwell as a legacy one fifth part of the Amount of said Appraisement of my Estate to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever, to be paid them within the term of three years by my Executors, — Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Grand Daughter Ann May one fourth part of the Remaining Sum including one Negro Girl by Name Ren as part of the fourth, to her and her heirs forever as a legacy to be paid her within the term of three years by my Executors, — Item, — I give and bequeath unto my beloved Grand sons John May and William Platt May one third part of the Remaining sum to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever as a legacy to be paid them within the term of three years by my Executors — Item, — I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son William Leay one half of the Remainder of my Estate to him and his heirs forever of his body forever — Item, — I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Joseph Leay the Remainder of my Estate to them and the heirs of his body forever, and I do hereby appoint my beloved sons William Leay and Joseph Leay and my beloved Grandson

god to bless me with I give and Dispose of in Manner and form follow-
ing, And first I will that my just debts be first paid, and funeral
charges, out of my Estate, I then give unto my beloved Wife, Margaret
Lambright all those Slaves which I have in a former deed bequeathed to her,
which are now dwelling, Mary, Mary, Lucy, Mary, Susan, John,
Charles, Frank and Riley with their children and increase also Horse and
Cattle, Rice and Furniture, Tools and the House I live in and the House I
own I also give unto my Daughter, Mary, One Negro Woman named Sarah
her children named Benah, Rose and with their free and
increase forever and her heirs forever, I also leave the Remains of my Slaves
to be kept together to work out my Debts, now due by me, for said, and then
unequal distribution to be made between my Children, Mary, Susan and John
