I now stand possessed of, or may hereafter have, get
or acquire, to be equally divided among them
when my said Daughter Margaret, shall arrive to
the Age of Twenty and one year, or at the day of her
Marriage. And it is my will and pleasure, that
if my said Daughter should die, or either of my
said Sons, before they shall attain to the Age of
Twenty and one year, then the averand of the one
so dying, shall be equally divided amongst the
surviving two; and if two of them should die before
they shall attain to the age of Twenty and one
year, then the averand of the two so dying shall
go to the survivor, to her or his Heirs and Assigns
forever. And in case of the death of any of my
three children, then it is my will and pleasure,
that all my lands shall be equally divided am-
ongst my three loving Sisters, Grace Carr, Elizabeth
and Catharine Hastings and their Heirs and Assigns
forever. And I furthermore will and assign, if my
children should die, before they or either of
them shall attain to the age of Twenty and
