 beloved wife, all my estate both real & personal wheresoever
 to be found (that is to say) I give and bequeath what proper-
 ty both real and personal I got by my said wife Eliza Green
 Walker at the time of my marriage to her & her heirs
 forever. The residue of my estate both real & personal
 I give and bequeath also unto my beloved wife during
 her natural life, that is to say should she die, without
 leaving husband or issue it is then my will and desire that
 the said residue of my estate (not taking into view what
 I got by marriage of my said wife shall go to my brothers
 and sisters (to wit) William and David Walker, Eliza
 Beth Walker, Sarah Fowler and Judith Walker, share
 and share alike, except Judith Walker who is to have
 double of either of the others. And it is my particular
 wish and desire, that Simmons Townes the husband of
 my sister Sarah shall never enjoy any part of the
 above property in his own right, but that it shall
 be placed in the hands of my brother in law George
 Walker as trustee to my said sister Sarah Fow-
 ler. And it is farther my will and desire

or issue that my two brothers in law John & Joseph Jones,
shall draw from the property first above bequeathed unto
my wife and her heirs forever the sum of one thousand
dollars each as a legacy; and then afterwards to draw
as equal heirs to the balance

Lastly in case my said wife marries, and leaves either hus-
band or issue, then and in that case it is my will & desire
that all my estate both real & personal go to her & her
heirs forever, And I do hereby nominate & appoint my
beloved wife my executrix & my trusty friend Joseph
Jones executor to this my last will & testament and
do utterly disallow & make void all other wills.
