In the Name of God, Amen. I Edward Sumner,
of Liberty County, in the State of Georgia, planter, being in a low
State of Health, but of sound Mind and memory, not
knowing the day of my Death, do make and Ordain this
my last Will and Testament: First of all, Committing
my Soul to the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and
my Body to the Earth, to be buried at the discretion of
my Executors: and my worldly Estate with
all my Rights in this life, I give and bequeath the
same in the manner and form following
It is my Will, that my lawfull debts and
Charges be paid out of my Estate, before any
division of the same be made. I Give and bequeath to my
beloved Sister Sally Mule, one half of my Tract of
Land on Mcaway, which I give to Her, Her Heirs
and assigns forever.

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I Give and bequeath to my brother in Law, Joseph
Wray, the other half of the Tract of Land above mentioned
being in Midway, which I give to him his Heirs and assigns forever.
I Give and bequeath to my nephew Joseph Bacon, my Negro
Wench named Lucy, and her Child named Jack, which
Wench and Child shall become his property at the
Age of Twenty One. but if the said Joseph Bacon should
die under Age, then and in that case, s^d Wench and
Child, shall be the property of Brother Thomas Summers
Surviving Heirs. I Give and bequeath to my beloved
Sister Nancy Winn, my Negro fellow named Brandon,
and my Silver Spoon, which I give to Her, Her Heirs
and assigns forever. I Give and bequeath to my
beloved sister Elizabeth Summer, my Negro Wench
named Mariab, my Boy named Prim^{onds} one
Feather Bed and furniture, which I give to Her
during ^{her} life, but to return at Her death, to my
Surviving Heirs of the first degree. I Give
and bequeath to my nephew Eawara Summer the
Tract of Land I now live on, provided he is law-
fully married or, lives to the Age of Twenty One when
I give to him, his heirs and assigns forever. —
Notwithstanding it is my Will, that my Brother
Thomas Summer shall have the use and benefit
of said plantation or Tract of Land, until his son
becomes of Age, and if he the s^d Thomas Summer
should outlive his son Eawara, then the said
Land, shall be his property, and at his disposal.
but if both die before the first mentioned Heir be-
comes of Age, then and in that case the Land above
mentioned, shall be the property of my Brother
Thomas Summer Surviving Heirs.

I Give and bequeath to my Brother Thomas Sumner
all the debt and residue of my Estate, to him, His Heirs
and Assigns forever. Lastly I constitute and appoint my
Brothers Thomas Sumner and Peter Winn, and my Nephews
Thomas Sumner and Edward Sumner Executors of this
my last Will and Testament. Wholy revoking and
annulling void all former Will by me heretofore made,
Votifying this and no other to be my last Will and
Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and Seal this Eighteenth day of May, in
the Year of Our Lord, One Thousand seven hundred and
eighty nine, and in the thirtieth Year of the In-
dependence of the United States of America.
