state of Health, but of sound mind and memory; not —
knowing the day of my Death, do make and Ordain this
my last will and Testament. First of all, Committing
my soul to the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and
my Body to the Earth, to be buried at the direction of
my Executrix: and my worldly Estate wherewith God
has blessed me in this life, I give and bequeath the
same in the manner and form following: —
It is my will, that my lawfull debts and charges be paid out of my Estate, before any division
of the same be made. I Give and bequeath to my
beloved Sister Sally Hill, one half of my Tract of
Land on Macaway, which I give to Her, her Heirs
and assigns forever.

I give and bequeath to my brother in law, Joseph
Way, the other half of the Tract of Land above mentioned
being on Midway, which I give to him his Heirs and Assigns forever.
I Give and bequeath to my nephew Joseph Bacon, my Negroe
Wench named Lucy, and her Child name Jack, which
Wench and Child shall become his property at the
Age of Twenty One. but if the said Joseph Bacon should
Die under Age, then and in that case, the Wench and
Child, shall be the property of Brother Thomas Sommers
Surviving Heirs. I Give and bequeath to my beloved
Sister Nancy Winn, my Negroe fellow named Brandon,
and my Silver spoon, which I give to Her, Her Heirs
and Assigns forever. I Give and bequeath to my
beloved Sister Elizabeth Sommers, my Negroe Wench
Nanica Mariah, my Boy named ~~primus~~ one
Teather Bed and furniture, which I give to Her
during ^{her} life, but to return at Her death, to my
surviving Heirs of the first degree. I Give
and bequeath to my Nephew Edwards Sommers the
Tract of Land I now live on, provided he is law-
fully married or, lives to the age of Twenty One when
I give to him, his Heirs and Assigns forever. —
Notwithstanding it is my will that my Brother
Thomas Sommers shall have the second benefit
of said plantation or Tract of Land, until his Son
comes of Age, &c. & if in the mean time he
should outlive his son Edwards, then the said —
Land, shall be his property, and at his disposal.
but if both die before the first mentioned their
comes of Age, then and in that case the Land above
mentioned, shall be the property of my brother
Thomas Sommers surviving Heir.

I give and bequeath to my brother Thomas Summer
all the rest and residue of my Estate, to him, his Heirs
and Aliors forever. So freely I constitute and appoint my
brother Thomas Summer and Peter Wines, and my Nephew
Thomas Summer and Edward Summer Executors of this
my Last Will and Testament. hereby revoking and
making void all former Wills by me heretofore made,
Witnessing this and no other to be my last Will and
Testament. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto

the Year of our Lord, One Thousand seven hundred and
eighty Nine, and in the thirtenth Year of the Re-
