My body I recommend to the Earth to be buried by my Executors hereafter named. My Soul I commend to God that gave it, through the merits of Jesus Christ. It is my will and desire, that my funeral expences, and all and every my just and lawful debts be paid and satisfied. And as to what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give devise and bequeath, in manner following: I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved and affectionate wife, Martha Carter, All and every my real Estate in the State of Georgia. Also all and every my Chattel Interest I may die, before dying, I have excepted which are to the Appearance and Nature of a common Bond. The one moiety or equal half part of said Estate, I give devise and bequeath to my said wife Martha; And it is hereby understood, that, She is to make provision and hold such moiety, the way of her own will and accord choose, She may bequeath to her the said Martha, her heirs and successors forever. — It is my further Will and desire, that, my said wife Martha, during her life hereafter, shall profit and have her proportion, the remaining moiety or equal half part of my said Estate and the profits arising therefrom, appropriate, for her use, service and paynement, and every year during her life hereafter as lief, to my Nephew James Carter, sonne of the profits arising therefrom, the sum of One hundred Dollars. And it is my further Will, and desire, that the said moiety or equal half part, of my said Estate, last mentioned, shall be the tenth of my said life, to day whereupon shall my first bequeath be upon my said wife Martha. Also, I give and bequeath unto my dear daughter, Mrs. James Carter, and her Friends, the daughter of John Lewis, and her Friends, the daughter of John Lewis, and in case of the death of the said James Carter, Daughter to the deceased before the death of my said Martha, a day of Intermarriage, then the said moiety or a portion, to be to the surviving Person to be a tenth moiety of that.
