one Negro boy named Chypon, to him, and his heirs forever,  
I give and bequeath unto my beloved Neare, Roddy Cole, three  
Negroes. Namely, Rachel, Saul, and Eady, provided she  
her Lawfull spouse, or arrives to the Years of twenty one,  
if not, it his wife and Doree, that the three above named  
Negroes should goes to my beloved Sister Harriett Colman  
and the three above Negroes to be Lodged in the hands  
of my Executors, for the above purpose: It her will, that my  
say Slave should be sold to pay my just debts, I give and  
bequeath, to Mrs Ann Dunham, my Bed and Furniture  
to her and her heirs, What Cash I have, and debts are  
owing me to be equal divided, between, my Brother  
John Cole, and my Brother in law Peter Colman.  
The peace of Kinner to be equal divided between: Roddy  
Cole, and my Son in law William Way; In witness whereof  
I the said James A Cole, to this my said last Will and Testament  
have hereunto set my hand and Seal this ninth day  
of December one Thousand and Seven Hundred and Ninety four,  
and in the thirteenth year of the independence  
of America: Thereby nominate and constitute my Brothers  
John Cole and my Brother in law, Peter Colman my
