 and considering my Mortality, do hereby make and ordain this my last
 Will and Testament, that is to say, first of all I commend my soul into
 the mercifull hands of Jesus Christ my only hope and Saviour and
 my body to decent Buriall at the direction of my Executors not
 doubting at the Resurrection of the same at the Last day and as
 touching my worldly goods, where with God has blessed me
 with in this life, I give and dispose of them in the following
 manner, that is to say, first my will is that all my debts
 and funeral charges be paid out of my Estate, I then
 give and bequeath unto my beloved Brother John Cole
 three Negroes, namely, Chesron, Aster, and Jimmy, to
 him, and his heirs forever,

I give and bequeath to John Cole, one Silver Watch, together
with all my Stock Cattle, to him, and his heirs ever; I give
and bequeath unto my beloved Brother in law, Peter Coleman
one Negro boy named Chepor, to him, and his heirs forever,
I give and bequeath unto my beloved Neare, Rocky Cole, three
Negroes. Mammey, Rachel, Saul, and Eddy, provided she
has lawfull Issue, or arrives to the Years of twenty one,
if not, it his wife and Desire, that the three above named
Negroes should goe, to my beloved Sister Harriet Coleman
and the three above Negroes to be lodged in the hands
of my Executors for the above purpose: It is my will, that my
sayd Mare should be sold to pay my Just debts, I give and
bequeath, to Mrs Ann Dunham, my Bed and Furniture
to her and her heirs, what Cash I have, and debts are
owing me to be equal divided, between, my Brother
John Cole, and my Brother in law Peter Coleman.
The peace of Linen to be equal divided between; Rocky
Cole, and my Son in law William May; In Witness where of
I the said James A Cole, to this my said last Will and Testament
have hereunto set my hand and Seal this nineteenth day
of December one Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety four,
and in the nineteenth Year of the said independent
of America: I hereby nominate and constitute my Brother
John Cole and my Brother in law, Peter Coleman my
Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
