Smith whom I appoint as my sole executor & Guardian to my said Children - as Witness my hand the Twenty first day of November 1823

Item It is my will that there shall be paid unto my nephew Elijahah Hudson in cash one fourth part of my Estate within one year after my decease

Item It is my will that my nephew and my niece Joseph and Mary Norman be paid one other fourth part of my Estate to be equally divided between them which payment to be made them within one year after my decease

Item I give and bequeath unto my friend Samuel Thompson my negro woman Hagar and her children Stephen
