In the Name of God, Amen. I Richard Cooper of Liberty and
State of Georgia, Planter, being very sick and weak in body, but
of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God; calling unto
and the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die, do make this my last will and testament,
that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend
my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it, and my body,
I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial,
at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the
general resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the
mighty power of GOD. And as touching such worldly estate
wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give
divise, and dispose of the same in the following manner,
and form: Item; I give and bequeath to my beloved wife;
five negro's; to Mr. a negro man named Brown, for & during her
life, or widowhood, at her death, or marrying, the said Brown shall
become a part of my estate, and applied to the benefit of the
hers thereof, the remaining four; to Lucy, her two children,
Philia, & Phoebe, & a boy named Cain, to be at the disposal
of her, my said wife, and her heirs forever, the aforesaid one
prosperity being now in a state of pregnancy which under her life
preserves, It is therefore my will, that should the aforesaid Lucy de-
cease in consequence of her present state of pregnancy, that my
said wife shall have the servant Betsy, in place of the said Lucy,
and that my said beloved wife Mary, shall be at liberty to live on
either of my plantations, and equally enjoy & possess a part of my
Land, and buildings, during her life, or widowhood & best remain-
der, that should the aforesaid Lucy recover after being delivered
of the child with which she is now pregnant, my said wife
shall have no claim to the before mentioned Betsy, who shall
in that case become a part of my estate; and with the residue,
after bequeathing to each of my daughters one negro girl,
lives of their part of my real estate, To Mrs. To Sarahah I be-
queath the girl Priscilla, to Mary the girl Charlotte, To Elizabeth
the girl Kate, To Heather, the girl Anne, is to be equally divided

Heather Sallens, and by them & their heirs to be freely enjoyed & pos-
sessed forever, Item I give & bequeath to my son in law Robert
Sallens two tracts of land adjoining each other, on or near
Canowhie making in all four hundred acres, by him & his heirs
