In the Name of God Omnipotent. — I William Baker,  
of the County of Liberty, and State of Georgia Planter, being in  
Health of Body and Sound Mind & Memory, Calling to mind my  
Mortality and knowing that it is Appointed for all men once to die  
do make and Appoint this my last Will & Testament, in manner  
and form following; Committing my Body to the Earth to be buried  
with a decent and Christian like burial, at the discretion of my  
Executors, And my Soul into the hands of God that gave it —  
I wish that all my lawfull Debts and Funeral Charges be  
paid; and in Order thereto I hereby instruct and implore my  
Executors to sell my Plantation & Tract of Land adjoining the tract  
of my land with all other pieces which have been purchased and  
acquired thereunto (if they find it necessary) and also to buy & sell  
for the Use of my Estate, as the Majority of them shall agree —  
I give to my well beloved Wife Anna Baker one seventh  
part of my Personal Estates, and the Use of One fourth part

all Other Wills, Testaments and Legacies whatever by me heretofore  
made or mentioned, Ratifying & Confirming this and No Others  
to be my last Will and Testament. - - - - -  
Published, pronounced & declared by the said William  
Baker to be his last Will & Testament this — day  
of — Anno Domini One thousand seven hundred  
and Ninety Six, in presence of us. — — —

I the with Named William Baker intending the within  
Instrument to be my last Will and Testament, but not till  
now Executed, do make this Codicil thereto, and to be a part  
of the same. — And first I will that that part of my Lands,  
as mentioned to be sold — as well as all my other Lands be  
equally divided between all my Sons, all which I give to  
them their Heirs and Assigns forever. I will that the widow  
Named Matilda and her Children be included as a part of  
what I have given my beloved Wife as within.

I then give and bequeath One Negro to be as nearly of equal  
Value as may be to each of my Daughters at the discretion  
of my Exors, & this to be in full for and in lieu of Lands  
which I give to them their Heirs and Assigns forever, —

And I do hereby Appoint Joseph Stevens Esq; or in the  
lacke of those named within — And I do hereby Ratify and  
further Confirm the within in every place that do not meditate  
against or Reflect on this Codicil — And this I publish, pronounce  
and declare to be, and in Addition to the within, my last Will  
and Testament, Executed this 4<sup>th</sup> day of October 1798.
