of the County of Liberty & State of Georgia planter, being th^t
undersigned as to Bodily health, yet of sound Memory and Under-
standing, thanks be unto God therefor, impriued with a sense
of the uncertainty of the life of man in this world, do make and
ordain this my last will & Testament, command my soul to stand
of God my creator and Redeemer, and desire that my Body
may be buried, with a decent and Christian like Burial, at
the Discretion of my Executors, and with respect to my worldly
Estate, after my lawfull Debts and funeral charges are paid
give and Bequeath the same in Manner & form following --
First. I give and Bequeath to my Beloved wife Sarah Quaterman
one Negro Man named Nero, my Beding Shay, Chair three Names
Crab, & Mahogany Chest of Drawers to her & her Heirs and Assigns
forever -- Also I give and Bequeath to my son John
Stewart Quaterman, one half of the Tract of Land on which
I now Dwell (say the upper half) and in order that it may be
Equally Divided according to number of Heirs it is my Will
that a Surveyor be employed to Run a line Due West & East
from North to South. Also I give and Bequeath to my son
John all that parcel of Land which was given to my
wife Sarah by her father John Stewart in his Last
will & Testament dated the 1st Day of January A.D. 1711.
The Mortar Swamp and my Silver Watch to him her
Heirs and Assigns forever -- Also I give and Bequeath
to my son Richard Quaterman the remaining and
lower half of my Tract of Land on which I now --

 and fifty Acre, or there abouts, Situate lying and being on a
 branch known by the name of howe pen branch in County of Liberty &
 State aforesaid, bounded on all sides by vacant lands at the time of its
 Survey, likewise one other tract of Land containing one hundred
 forty three Acre, or there abouts, Situate lying and being on the
 River Canouchie, bound North by said River, East by Land of Mathis
 Bennett, West by Land of William Way and South by Land unknown
 abounding Mahogany Bark & Book car to him, his Heirs & assigns
 forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Anna
 Quaterman, one Negro Girl named Damarah in her service
 to her, her Heirs and Assigns forever. Item. I give and bequeath
 to my Daughter Sarah Quaterman, one Negro Girl named
 Harris, in her service of Land, to her, her Heirs & Assigns forever. Item.
 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Quaterman, and her
 Girl named Tatrica in her service of Land, to her, her Heirs & Assigns forever.
 Item. I give and bequeath all the Rest and Residue of my Estate
 Both Real and Personal (except such cattle as I have given to my
 Children in my life time, which I will divide among them may
 Retain the same to be Equally Divided unto, as I between my
 wife Sarah and all my Children to them, their Heirs & Assigns
 forever. Item. It is my will that my Sons shall receive
 their part or portion of my Estate, Both Real and Personal
 when they arrive at the Age of twenty years, or are lawfully
 married, whichever shall first happen, and that my
 Daughters, shall receive their portions of my Estate, at marriage
 or when they arrive at the age of eighteen years, whichever

In witness whereof, I do hereby declare, That if any of my said Children shall die before the time herein limited for their Receiving their parts or portions of my Estate into their own hands, & so my will, that the part or portion whether it be the real or personal Estate of the Child so Dying, be Equally Divided among between my wife Sarah if she shall be then living, and all my surviving Children, or the Representatives of such of my Children as shall then be Dead, and have left Representatives - It is my will that if either of my Children to whom I have given a Negro in Lien of Land shall loose said Slave by Death or otherwise, then the said Lien (if it happens when the heir is under age) shall be made good out of my Estate, by another Slave in the Room thereof, about the same Value, at the Judgment of my Executors.

Also - It is my will that my beloved wife Sarah Eastman shall have the privilege of residing on the Plantation on which I now live, if I have the use of the same in common with my Children, During the time she shall remain my widow. And lastly, I nominate, constitute, & appoint my beloved wife Sarah, Executrix of my son John Stewart, my friends Thomas Stevens, James Wallow, Joseph Eastman & John Boggs Executors of this my Last will and Testament, & I do hereby empower them to add unto my Estate by making jointure, or any part thereof as they may judge will be for the advantage of my Heirs without being liable to suffer Damage on Account of any Loss that may happen thereby.
