

In the name of God Amen I Andrew Wallhouse, of the State of Georgia and County of Liberty, planter, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body, knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die; but after this the judgment; do therefore make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following: — First, and principally, I commit and commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, who first gave it unto me, humbly and earnestly imploring him, of his infinite goodness and mercy, for the sake, and through the merits and favoring intercession, of a once crucified but now ascended Saviour, freely to forgive and pardon all my sins, hoping for the reunion of soul and body at the great resurrection day. And as for such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give and bequeath them as is herein after specified.

Item 1. I give and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Wallhouse, and to her heirs forever, all that part of my estate (of what nature or kind soever the same may be) that she was possessed of at the time of my intermarriage with her; also my riding carriage, and the horses belonging thereto Item 2. After the payment of all my just debts (which are both few and small) and after the payment of such legacies or sums of money, as are in this instrument directed to be made, and not previously thereto, I give to my said wife Elizabeth Wallhouse for and during the term of her natural life, the following fourteen negro slaves, who are to be fed and clothed at her expense; namely Charles, Sally, Dispatch, Abby, Jim, Lydia, Ben, George, Phoebe, Little George, Little Jerry, Mollie, Big Nancy and Laska, which said negro slaves shall not, at any time, or in any manner, be subject to the debts that may be contracted by my said wife, or by any other person for her. My said wife shall be entitled to all the profits arising from the labour of said slaves, and shall be exempted from the payment of all State and County taxes that may be due on them. And I do hereby direct my executors herein after named, to pay such taxes out of the profits or proceeds of that part of my estate which shall, in a future item of this instrument, be bequeathed jointly, to my son George W. Wallhouse, and to the issue of my daughter Sarah Ann McConnell. It is hereby directed, that the negro slaves so named shall be kept within the limits of Liberty County, and that they shall not be removed therefrom without the consent and approbation of the executors of this my last will and testament; who are hereby fully authorized, at all times, to have control over this part of my estate, during the natural life of my said wife, so far, at least, as to have the power of sentencing or disallowing the choice or appointment of an overseer or manager of said slaves, and of continuing or discontinuing his services, as to whom shall appear just and reasonable. After the decease of my said wife, the slaves so named, together with the future issue of the females, shall be disposed of in like manner with such part of my estate as is bequeathed jointly, and not separately, to my son, and to the issue of my daughter. (See Item the eleventh.)

Item 3. My said wife shall have the privilege of the same to reside at or cultivate, separately, as much of my land as shall be requisite for the support herein appertaining to her, free from rent, and from every other charge.

Item 4. I also give and bequeath unto my said wife, during her widowhood, my dwelling house on the Sandhills, and one half of the household and kitchen furniture belonging thereto, but under this express condition, that my child or children shall, at no time, be made chargeable for board, whilst residing with her; but said child or children shall bear an equal proportion of house expenses. Said house and premises, at the decease or marriage again, of my said wife, as the case may be, shall revert to and become a part of my real and personal estate, and shall be held by my son and my daughter as joint tenants for life.

Item 5. And I do further give and bequeath unto my said wife, in lieu of her dower, the sum of twelve hundred dollars, to be paid by my executors from funded stock, or in any other way, out of money arising from my estate, that to them shall appear most convenient.

Item 6. To my son George W. Wallhouse, and to his heirs forever, I give and bequeath the following

negro slaves, and the future issue of the females; namely, Hector, Celia, Carpenter Jack, boy Abram and girl Anna; also my plantation, and all the lands, cleared and unclered, situated thereon, on the North side of the Swamp, down to John Way's upper road line. I also give unto my said son, and to his heirs forever, fifteen slaves in the Planters Bank of the State of Georgia, one half of my ready money, and one half of all my evidences of debt.

Item 7. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Ann Mc Connell, and to her heirs forever, the following negro slaves, together with the future issue of the females; namely, Miriah, Kate, Celia, Moses and — and also fifteen slaves in the Planters Bank of the State of Georgia.

Item 8. I give and bequeath to Mr. Joseph Way, and to his heirs forever, the lot of land on the Sand hills, on which he now resides, containing about five acres.

Item 9. As a token of my regard for my negro man Hector, who has faithfully served me for many years in the capacity of a driver, I give and bequeath unto him the sum of one hundred dollars.

Item 10. It is my will, that the sum of five hundred dollars be appropriated by my executors to such charitable purposes as in their discretion they shall think most advisable. They may, if they think proper divide this sum into different parcels, and pay them at different periods; or they may, if they think best, pay the whole at once. They will probably find sufficient funds belonging to my estate, to be thus applied, as soon as they shall qualify.

Item 11. One half of the remainder of my real and personal estate, I give and bequeath to my son George W. Walthour, and to his heirs forever, and the other half I give and bequeath to the child or children of my daughter Sarah Ann Mc Connell, and to the surviving of them. Should any die during their minority, my said daughter to have the use of the same during her natural life. This property shall not, at any time, nor in any manner, be subject to the debt of her present or any future husband, whether the same may have been contracted previously or subsequently to the date of this my last will and testament. Nor shall any division of this property mentioned in this item be made between my said son and the issue of my daughter, until my said son shall alter his condition by marriage, but the profits of this part of my estate shall, in the mean time, be equally divided between my said son and daughter.

Lastly, I make, ordain, constitute and appoint my friends, Major John Stevens, Thomas Mallard, James Bacon and Thomas Lupterman, with my son George W. Walthour, the executors of this my last will and testament; and I do hereby direct, that at the decease of any of them my executors, the survivors shall appoint another, so as to keep up the number of five executors, so long as any part of the real or personal estate mentioned in this instrument, shall be considered as belonging to my estate. And I do hereby enjoin it on my said executors, as my dying request, that they carry this instrument into effect, agreeably to the tenor, true intent, meaning and construction of the same. And I do hereby utterly revoke and disannul all other wills and testaments by me at any time heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my true and only last will and testament. — In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal, this twenty sixth day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty two.
