sum of five hundred dollars, for which payments, well and truly to be
made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly
and severally, firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated
at Richborough, this second day of May in the year of our Lord eighteen
hundred and thirty one, and in the 55th year of American indepen-
dence.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the Court
aforesaid hath this day bound unto the said Randal Mr. Donald a poor
orphan of said County, by the name of John Mr. Cardell, son of

Mr. Cardell deceased, of the age of about fourteen years, for seven years,
or until he shall arrive to the age of twenty one; Now, if the said Ran-
dal Mr. Donald shall treat, use and deal with the said orphan, according
to an act of the Legislature in such cases made and provided, Then
the above obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force and virtue.

In the name of God. Amen I Anne Powell, of the County of
Chatham County } Liberty, widow, being of sound mind, memory & understanding, do
make this my last will & testament in manner following. — I give my gold watch
to my daughter Jane Danwoody. It is my will & desire, that no appraisement be
made of my household, kitchen furniture, &c. but that my son James S. Bullock take
possession of them for his use & benefit. And I give also to my said son, & to his heirs
forever, my servant man William. — I give to my daughter Jane Danwoody, for her
sole & separate use, & not subject to the debts of her husband, my negro woman named
Kester. — In lieu of a negro man named Tom to the heirs of my son John S. Bullock,
I relinquish all claim to four hundred & fifty dollars I advanced him to pay an in-
stalment called in by the Directors of the Planters Bank Savannah in the year
eighteen hundred & eighteen. — I will & direct, that all the rest & residue of my
estate, real & personal, be kept together, & managed to the best advantage, until all
my debts are paid and satisfied by my executors hereinafter named. — I will, devise
& bequeath the rest, residue & the

Daughter in law Charlotte Bulloch, for herself & children Wm. Gaston Bulloch & Jane Bulloch, heirs of my deceased son John S. Bulloch, & in case of the death of my grand children, Wm. Gaston & Jane Bulloch, to be equally divided, that is to say, one half to my son James S. Bulloch, & the other half to my son in law John Dunwoody. — It is my will, that the children of Hester, named Bell, Alfred, Caroline & Clarissa, shall be taken by Mrs. Mrs. Dunwoody in their proportion or third part of my estate at the division, at their appraised value. — It is my will, that my son James S. Bulloch may take my servant man Sam in his proportion or third part, at his appraised value. — It is my will, and I do hereby authorise my acting executor or executors, in order to make a division of my estate, after my debts are paid, to sell the whole of my estate, real & personal, for that purpose, & to invest the proceeds in other property or securities, as he or they may see fit, for the same purposes & uses as herein after devised, & in the proportions expressed.

It is my will, & I do hereby authorise my acting executor or executors to sell that part of my estate, both real & personal, at the appraised cash value, left to my grand children Wm. Gaston & Jane Bulloch, to my son James S. Bulloch, taking his bond payable to the trustees of my said grand children Wm. Gaston & Jane Bulloch, as they become severally of age, the interest payable annually at the rate of six per cent for their support. — It is my will, & I do hereby authorise my acting executor or executors to sell that part of my real estate at the appraised cash value, left to my son in law John Dunwoody & my daughter Jane Dunwoody, to my son James S. Bulloch, taking his bond payable as may be agreed by him & my son in law John Dunwoody. — I give, devise & bequeath all my real & personal estate as follows, that is to say, one third to John Dunwoody & Joseph Jones in trust for my son James S. Bulloch, during his life time, and after his death to his wife Hetty & his children, equally to be divided, for ever.

One third to James S. Bulloch & Jos. Jones, in trust for my son in law Mrs. Dunwoody & my daughter Jane Dunwoody, during their lives, & the life of the survivor, and after the death of the survivor, then to the children of my daughter Jane Dunwoody forever. And the remaining one third to James S. Bulloch, John Dunwoody & Joseph Jones, in trust for my grand children Wm. Gaston Bulloch & Jane Bulloch, heirs of my deceased son John S. Bulloch, and in case of the death of my grand children before they become of age, to be equally divided, that is to say, one half to my son James S. Bulloch during his life time, and after his death to his wife Hetty & his children, equally to be divided, for ever. The other one half to my son in law John Dunwoody & my daughter Jane Dunwoody, & after the death of the survivor, then to their children forever. — I will & bequeath to ^{the} Georgia Education Society fifty dollars, and to the Southern Auxiliary Bible Society twenty five dollars.

I nominate and appoint my friend Joseph Jones, my son James S. Bulloch & my son in law Mrs. Dunwoody executors of this my last will. — In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty.
