to the said Elizabeth Dunwoody, all, each and every of the following
negro slaves, named Sam, Tenant, Tony, Trap, Bram, Henry, Lucy, Maria-
ly, Sarah, Hagar, Clarinda, Statira, Diana, Hannah, Melia, Mariah,
Peter, Tony, Richard and Bram: To have and to hold all and every the
aforesaid negro slaves unto the said Elizabeth Dunwoody, and the heirs of her
body, forever: And in case the said Elizabeth Dunwoody shall leave no issue
after her death, the aforesaid negro slaves shall be subject to such dis-
posal as she, the said Elizabeth, in her last will and testament, may make.
And I, the said James Smith, all, each and every of the said negro slaves,
the said Elizabeth Dunwoody, her heirs and assigns, against me, the said
James Smith, my executors and administrators, and all and every other per-
son and persons whomsoever, Shall and will warrant, and forever defend
by these presents; of each and every which said negro slaves, I the said
James Smith have put the said Elizabeth Dunwoody in full possession at
the time of the sealing and delivery of these, presents.— In witness whereof
I have put my hand and seal this twenty eighth day of March one thou-
sand eight hundred and twelve.
