And I, the said James Smith, all, each and every of the said negro slaves, the said Elizabeth Dunwoody, her heirs and assigns, against me, the said James Smith, my executors and administrators, and all and every other persons and persons, whomsoever, shall and will warrant, and forever defend, by these presents; of each and every which said negro slaves, I the said James Smith have put the said Elizabeth Dunwoody in full possession at the time of the sealing and delivery of these presents. — In witness whereof I have put my hand and seal this twenty eighth day of March one thousand eight hundred and twelve.
