In the name of God Amen I James Cantley
of the county of Liberty in the State of Georgia,
being infirm & much afflicted with bodily
sickness, but of sound mind and memory, do hereby
& herein this to be my last will and testament in
maner and form following

Imprimis I devise and bequeath unto my beloved
Charlboth Blanford Cantley, my son William Cantley
any other child or children with whom my dear
said wife may be now pregnant or which she may here
after have lawfully begotten by me on her body, all
estate real and personal to be equally divided between
them share and share alike and in case of the death
of either of my said children then his or her share to
be equally divided — or any the survivor or survivors
or in case of my wife's death then her share to be
equally divided between my children or in case of failure
of increase of issue to my said son William Cantley
his heirs forever, or in case of the death of my said
son William before his said mother (and in case

of failure of increase of issue by me lawfully begotten
on my aforesaid wife) that then and in that case
I bequeath my whole estate real and personal unto my
beloved wife Charlboth Blanford and her heirs forever
Provided that first my just debt and funeral expenses be
paid as early as possible by my executors and committee here
after named — And that whatever share of my estate (which
consist of seven ty negroes at the plantation whereon I reside
in this county and state aforesaid, and of a proportion to what
I am entitled of certain negroes in the State of South Carolina
here left by my grandmother (Elizabeth Williams before her
marriage with Philip Williams of said State & the
widow of my grandfather James (brother of my progeni-
tor, under the will of my grandfather David Williams,
to five hundred and fifty acres of land on the forks of
Altamaha river in the State of Georgia called the Butler
town tract, and of the plantation whereon I now reside
which were purchased by me from William Wilson, Da-
vid Bliffor, Roger Wilson and others of the State of
North Carolina, and of my stock of cattle on the said
plantation and my household furniture & planti-
lion tools) which shall be decreed my said wife
under any order or decree of probate under the courts
of said State of Georgia, shall be in lieu of all Dower
or which she might otherwise claim upon my said estate.
Secondly and Lastly It is my will & devise that my said
beloved wife Elizabeth Blanford and my loving
friend, William Inglesby my father in law to
be executor & executors of this my last will & c^o
