County of Liberty } Know all men by these presents, that we, Moses W. Way & George W. Walther, are held and firmly bound and obliged unto the honorable the Court of Ordinary for the County of Liberty in the State aforesaid in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, to be paid to the Judges of said Court, their successors in office or assigns, for which payment, well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, jointly and severally, and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals, and dated at Okefenobee, the third day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty one.

The Condition of the above obligation is such, that if the above bounden Moses W. Way, administrator of the goods, chattels and credits of Mary G. Stevens, late of said County deceased, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, possession or knowledge of the said Moses W. Way, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him, and the same do make do exhibit into the said Court of Ordinary, when he shall be thereto required; and such goods, chattels and credits do well and truly administer according to law, and make a just and true account of his actings and doings therein, when required by the Superior Court, or Court of Ordinary for the County; and all the rest of the goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first allowed by the said Court, shall deliver and pay to such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law; and if it shall hereafter appear, that any last will and testament was made by the said deceased, and the same be proved before the Court, and the executors obtain a certificate of the probate thereof; and the said administrator do in such case, if required, render and deliver up the said letters of administration, then this obligation to be void, else to remain in full force.
