by my wife, and that the proceeds, together with monies owing
from accounts and notes due, be applied to the discharge of
my highest debt. - I think I leave that the improved lot
A 277, and the unimproved adjoining lot A 280, known in
the place of the Town of Liberty, together with my house and
land, be retained for the benefit and use of my family.
Next, and lastly, I nominate and appoint my much beloved
and beloved friend, Thomas L. Bacon, executor to this my
last will and testament. In testimony whereof, I have
hereunto set my hand and seal, this 10th day of December
1819
