In the name of God Amen. I Dorella Lewis widow of the County
and State aforesaid, planteer being of sound mind, memory and understanding; and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and
testament, hereby revoking all former wills or codicils by me heretofore made. My body I
recommend to the earth, to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors herein
after named. My soul I recommend to God, who gave it, through the merits of Jesus Christ.

It is my will and desire, that my funeral expenses, and all and every of my just and
lawful debts, be paid and satisfied. And as to what worldly estate it has pleased God
to bless me with, I give, devise and bequeath in manner following Item. I give, devise
and bequeath unto my son William J. Way the following named negro slaves; Isaac,
his wife Sisiah, and their child Prince, to him, his heirs and assigns forever. Item. I give,
devise and bequeath unto my daughter Susan S. Russell wife of Edward Rus-
sell, the following named negro slaves; Lenah, known as Long Lenah, her child and
my negro girl Blendar, to her and her children forever. Item. I give the cream
horse which I purchased from Mr. S. Stetton to the Estate of Samuel Lewis, my
late husband, under the same restrictions as the property bequeathed me during my
natural life. Item. The balance of my estate, both real and personal, I give and
bequeath unto my children William J. Way, Susan S. Russell, Sarah H. Lewis, Mary E.
Lewis, Ann S. Lewis and Caroline K. Lewis to be equally divided between them
three and share alike, to them, and to their children forever. Item. It is my wish,
and I direct, that the whole of my estate, both real and personal, shall be kept
together until all my debts are paid; and then the neat proceeds to be added
to the funds of the Estate of Samuel Lewis, my late husband, until all the debts
of said Estate are paid. After the settlement of both the Estate's debts, then continued
until a fund is raised sufficient to purchase a negro girl between sixteen or seventeen
years of age, likely, or such a one as my brother Charlton Hines may think proper,
which negro girl I give and bequeath unto my grandson Samuel Lewis Russell, son
of Edward and Susan Russell, to him and his children forever. Item. It is my wish
that my negro woman Lucy have a choice which of my children she would prefer living
with; and I request the one which she chooses will take her, at the division of my es-
tate, at the appraised value. Item. I request that my executors hereafter to be
named, well, with as little delay as possible, if not done previous to my death, cause
to be built suitable monuments over the graves of my husband & children, the expense
of which I direct paid for out of my estate. Lastly, I do hereby nominate, constitute
and appoint my son William J. Way, my brothers Charlton Hines & Lewis Hines, and my
friend William N. Way, executors of this my last will and testament relying in them
every confidence as to the due execution thereof. — In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this the third day of August in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine.

State aforesaid planter, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of this mortal
life, do make this my last will and testament.

Item 1st I will that my body be decently buried at the discretion of my executors
hereafter named.

2^d I will that all my just debts be paid.

3^r. It is my will and desire that the following negroes named Harry and Phyllis, bought
at Sheriff's sales from John Stewart, Sheriff of Liberty County, and recorded in the Clerk's office
in Book E pages 459 & 460 sold as the property of Peter Farley Winn, and now in the posse-
sion of said Winn shall go to the son of the said Peter Farley Winn, named Abel Winn, as soon
as the debts are paid by said property, which I have assumed for the said Peter Farley Winn.

4th. It is again my will, that a certain tract of land sold as the property of the said Peter Farley
Winn, & purchased by me at Sheriff's sales, and sold by Benjamin Melle, Sheriff of Liberty County
to the same recorded in the Clerk's Office in Book E pages 458 & 459, be the property of
the son of the said Peter Farley Winn, named Abel Winn, as soon as the debts are paid which
I assumed for the said Peter Farley Winn.

5th. It is also my will, that the following named negroes, to wit, Charlotte, Harriet, Abby, Lewis,
David, Lenah, Peggy, Elizabeth, Frank, Bristol Bob, Loney & George, making thirteen in number,
and now in the possession of the said Peter Farley Winn, and purchased by me at Sheriff's
sales from William Maxwell, the then Sheriff of Liberty County (bill of sale recorded in
the Clerk's office in Book I folio 257) be the property of the son of the said Peter Farley
Winn, named Abel Winn, together with the future increase of the females, as also the in-
crease of the female slaves named in the third item of this my will, to him, & to his heirs
& assigns, so soon as the debts are paid, which I assumed for the said Peter Farley Winn.

Item 6th. I give and bequeath to my beloved son Joseph Austin my young horse called Liverpool

7th. I give, devise and bequeath to my said beloved son Joseph Austin my principal dwell-
ing house, and furniture and out buildings, where I now reside reserving the free use &
privilege of the same to my affectionate wife, and her sister Lony Valley, together with the
furniture, as it now stands, also a supply of provisions, vegetables & other products of the plan-
tation, for family use, and the benefit of the stock, together with a sufficiency of good land for
the negroes belonging to my said wife and her sister to plant and enjoy the same during their
natural lives as they did during my life time.

8th. It is also my will and desire, that my said wife, and her sister Lony Valley, be provided
with a good, big, house and boy, to be at their or either of their disposal at all times during
their natural lives. - I would leave my wife more, but she has been amply provided for
