Item 3^d It is my will, that all of my interest, claim, right and title, to lands belonging to the estates of William J. Baker and William W. Baker be equally divided between my mother, and brothers, Artemas Baker, Samuel Baker, John Baker and Richard Baker.

Item 4th It is my desire, that all of my interest, right and claim to stocks of cattle & hogs, belonging to the estates of William J. Baker and William W. Baker, be equally divided between my mother Elizabeth Baker, and my brothers, Artemas Baker, Samuel Baker, John Baker and Richard Baker.

Item 5th and lastly, I do appoint my mother Elizabeth Baker, Artemas Baker, Samuel Baker & Thomas Z. Cassels, executrix and executors to this my last will and testament, disannulling all other wills and testaments heretofore made by me.

Calling to mind the mortality of man, knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, being in a low state of body, but in my perfect senses, mind and memory, do this day make and ordain this my last will and testament, revoking all and every former intentions whatever, and do hereby make and ordain this my last will and testament, and dispose of my earthly goods in the following manner. First of all, my body to be committed to the dust, to be buried at the discretion of my friends. First of all, I give and bequeath to my loving wife my plantation and mill, and the tract of land on which I now live, during her widowhood, or till my youngest daughter comes to eighteen years of age, my wife to possess the above said premises during her life or widowhood. At her death to be sold, and equally divided among my heirs. My wife to have and own all the property she possessed before our marriage, with all she may accumulate by her own industry, with all my plantation tools, with her choice of horses I may possess at my death. - Secondly, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Julian Susan Candace Christina one certain cow called Hornpipe, one called Nags, and one called Rhem, with their increase, one heifer called Banek, one big pot, all to be taken care of for her till she comes of age. - Thirdly, All the rest of my property to be sold, and, when my debts are paid equally divided between my first wife's children. - I hereby constitute and ordain my loving wife Zephah Morgan, my [son] Gabriel Morgan, and Duncan Bahammon, my only sole executors. - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of April 1832, and in the fifty fourth year of American Independence.
