poses and saith, that he does the last
 will and testament of William Graham, late of said
 County deceased, as it now stands of record in the of-
 fice of the Court of Ordinary in said County. That
 the same was drawn at the instance and request of the
 said testator, and in conformity, as he believes, to his
 directions. That the impressions of this deponent, as well as
 he can now recollect them, were, that his daughter, Mrs.
 Nelly McIntosh, the wife of Mr. Robert McIntosh, was to
 be heir to all the property, both real and personal, of the
 said testator not otherwise specially bequeathed and devised,
 that particular mention was made of the land, as he then
 supposed, with a view of debarring Mr. McIntosh from sell-
 ing the same. That he verily believes, that he was, at that
 time, wholly ignorant of the report of Mrs. McIntosh's be-
 ing an illegitimate child of the said testator.
