Liberty County } I Daniel Stewart, of the State and County aforesaid, planter,
do make this my will & testament as follows: to wit, I give & bequeath to my dear wife Sarah all
the property which she brought me when married, except such as has been sold or died, with the
increase of the property, to her and her assigns forever. I also give her my household furniture during her
life; at her death to be considered as my estate, except such part as she may give away. I also give
my dear wife my four wheeled carriage, with the horses now belonging to the same, to her and her
assigns forever. I give her the one half of my cattle & sheep, and all plantation tools, wagon, cart,
ploughs, &c. I also give her the one half of such money as may arise from the present crop, after all
my just debts are finally paid. - It is my intention and wish, that the whole of my landed estate re-
main for the use of my dear wife during her natural life, and she is hereby authorized to occupy any
part of the same unobstructed, but at her death to be my estate for the benefit of my children or
grand children, as the case may be. - I also give my dear wife my copper fellow Bobo, because
I got him in an exchange for a fellow of Estate of Mrs. Hines. No part of corn provisions is to
be taken from the plantation, unless by consent of my wife.

I now give and bequeath to my dear children or grand children the whole of the re-
mainder of my property in the manner following; that is to say, It is my intention and wish, the
same may be divided or put into four divisions, equal as possible. One division or fourth part I
give and bequeath to my grand children, Daniel, Sarah & Ripley, children of my deceased son
John, to them, and their heirs and assigns forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my grand children, the
children of Col. Josiah Wilson, one other division or fourth part, jointly to them, their heirs and assigns forever;
provided nevertheless, my daughter Mary to have the use of this little pittance during her life. Item. I
give and bequeath to my son Daniel M. Stewart one other division or fourth part of my estate, to-
gether with my gold watch, to him, his heirs and assigns forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my
daughter Mrs. Martha Elliott one other division or fourth part of my estate for her own use,
to her and her assigns forever. - My landed estate, with any other species of property, which may
hereafter become (after the death of my wife) my estate, are to be distributed and divided in and among
my children & grand children in an equal manner, by four dividends, as specified already.

I now nominate my dear wife Sarah an executrix, my friend Elevation Hines, my son in
law Col. Josiah Wilson, & my son Daniel M. Stewart, Executors to this my last will and testament.

I Lydia Talipson, of the County of Telfair & State of Georgia, through the mercy of God being of sound mind, and having the perfect use of my reason, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following, viz. Unto my daughter Sarah Jones, with whom I now live, I give the use of all the property which I may be possessed of at this place, viz. one negro fellow named Jim, one black horse, together with my clothing, furniture, &c. for her to keep in possession during her natural life, and to have the free use of said property for her own individual use and support; and at her decease said property to be given to her offspring, if any she have, and if she should die leaving no offspring, said property is, at her decease, to be equally divided among my other three children, Benjamin, Lydia & Mary. — I wish to be understood, that said property is to be disposed of for no other purpose but for the support, and at the request, of my said daughter Sarah Jones. — And whereas there are sundry debts, for money lent, &c. due me, and a suit depending respecting the estate of my last husband, it is my desire, that all money which may hereafter be collected for me, or on my account, from said debts, and also all monies that may be obtained from the said estate, shall be equally divided among my four children, Benjamin, Lydia, Mary & Sarah.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint Matthew Jones and William Whiddon executors of this my last will and testament, revoking all others.
