the sum of one hundred dollars, to him in hand paid before the sealing
and delivery of this Deed, Hath bargained, sold and delivered, and by these
presents Doth bargain, sell, and convey, unto Henry Strom all that tract
or parcel of land, containing two hundred acres in the State of Georgia,
and Liberty County, on the waters of the River, bounded South by
John B. Girardeau's land, North by James Davis's land, and on the
other sides by vacant land at the time of survey. It having such
courses and marks, natural and artificial, as the plat and grant,
with this deed delivered, represent, unto the said Henry Strom, and his
heirs forever in fee simple: And I, the aforesaid General Washington
Smith, will warrant, and ever defend the right and title, turf and
twig, of the above land and premises unto the above named Henry
Strom, and to his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns forever,
against the lawful claim of all and every person or persons whatsoever
whereunto I bind myself, my executors, administrators, heirs, and af-
signs, and every of them, separately and jointly. In testimony whereof
