This Indenture made this twenty first June in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and in the thirty
ninth year of the Independence of the United States of America, Between
General Smith, of the County of Bulloch and State aforesaid, of the one
part and Margaret White, of the County of Bulloch and State aforesaid,
of the other part, Witnesseth, that the said General Smith, for and in con-
sideration of the sum of twenty five dollars cash, to be paid him, in hand paid,
at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is
humbly acknowledged, have granted, bargained sold, aliened, conveyed and
confirmed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and
confirm, unto the said Margaret White, her heirs and assigns, all that tract
of land, lying and being in the State of Georgia and County of Scriven,
lying on the South side of Little Ogeechee, containing three hundred and
fifty acres, surveyed 10th day of February 1806, for General Smith, and
granted

To have and to hold the said premises,
with all and singular the rights, members and appurtenances thereof
whatsoever, to the said Margaret White, being, belonging or in any wise ap-
pertaining, with the remainder and remainders, reversion and reversions,
rents, issues and profits thereof, to the only proper use, benefit and behalf
of her the said Margaret White, her heirs, executors, administrators and
assigns, in fee simple. And the said General Smith, for his heirs, executors
and assigns, his agents, and all and every other person or persons whatsoever
shall and will, from time to time, and at all times, warrant, and forewarn
and defend, by virtue of these presents. In witness whereof the said Gen-
eral Smith hath jointly and conjointly, voluntarily, set his hand and af-
fixed his seal the day and year above written.

premises or dwelling-house, to them the said Mary and Henry White,
heirs, executors or administrators, from henceforth, as their proper
goods and chattels, absolutely, without any manner of condition. In wit-
