Liberty County } Being warned by almighty God of my approaching dissolution from frequent bleeding at my stomach being perfectly collected I have thought fit to make this my last will & testament to wit I give and bequeath unto my sister Susanna Girardine the upper or southwestwardly part of Cedar grove tract a line to divide the same to begin at the second angle of the canal claim) leaving the little swamp as designated on the plat in the lower or Northeastwardly front) and running S 10 E until it intersects the division line between the tract now called Baileys and cedar grove. I also give and bequeath unto her two negroes by name Capine & Lizzy with seven cows & calfs and the several mares called Calypso with all their increase to her and her heirs forever.

It is my will that two thirds of the undivided tract of land near Sunbury held by me commonly known by the Distillery land and called by me Rush brook be divided into three equal parts as soon as may be convenient and that my affectionate wife Eliza: a wife Mary Ann Girardine to have choice of one of such divisions together with the Northeastwardly front of cedar grove tract with all my remaining negro and stock of horses and cattle sheep hogs &c to her and her heirs forever except old Frank who is to be set free on the day of her marriage and give him his tools with a cow and calf. — The other two divisions of Rush brook to be decided by lot between my two sisters one of them to belong to my sister Susannah and the other to my sister Eliza: with Maybank together with the fort lot I bought from Pomroy to them & their heirs forever — And I do hereby appoint my brother in law Andrew Maybank or his attorney to settle all my debts and left all my mortgages, and after the mortgagor of the property I have with John Cooper is settled it shall be disposed of in the following manner to wit Tom Fanny Abram Solomon Jean and old Frank be the property of my sister Eliza: with Maybank and her heirs forever, and that Dick Paul Sinah Savry and Rose be the property of my sister Susannah and her heirs forever; and that Harry Nancy July Anna Clara Alphonse and a young child of Nancy's together with their labor & issue be the property of Doctor Lewis & Parsons

permitted to be married in the case of the death of both
thus attaining the age of twenty one years, but if both
die first and in that case all such property to be
increased I give and bequeath to my two natural children
Maybank and Amazena Girardian to be equally divided
between them and share alike, but if both or either of the said
should leave lawful issue before they attain to the age of
twenty one years in that case such issue to inherit the
property vested in the parent, and that my wife should
be so constituted as to suffice their father or his heirs
hers to inherit the said property or any part of it, if the
children should die at any age, and I do hereby "by
Andrew Maybank John Jones and Joseph Jones" "do
to put that part of my will which respects the two
now in force, and they have full power to take the prop-
erty out of the hands of Samuel Jacob Mason who
a majority of them shall think proper, and if one of
them should die the remaining two shall appoint another
so that the two children may always have three
and guardians; and it is my will that all Andrew
Maybank shall sell the following property for the
use benefit of the heirs subject to the same restrictions
as hereunto mentioned that is Samuel I have
himself to have no share in any of my property
whatever in no case viz the plantation called
finchiquit bought of Stephen Williams one thousand
and acre of land on the Desert, one thousand
of land in Glynn county known by the name
Paxton Town and an Island in the Alatamaha
river containing two hundred and fifty acres
