I Hardy Deloach, of the State of Georgia and County of Liberty, being indisposed in body, though of sound mind and memory, allying to mine the mortality of my body, and that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following. First, I recommend my soul unto the keeping of Almighty God who gave it, and my ^{body} to the earth, to be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner. And as touching the worldly estate, with which God has blessed me in this life, I give and dispose of in the following manner. First, I give and bequeath to my eldest daughter Rachel Howard's children eight cows and calves. To my daughter Sarah Ann Way eight cows and calves and to my daughter Fanny Davies's children eight cows and calves, to them and their heirs forever. And I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Deloach all the remaining part of my property, both real and personal, consisting of two negroes, Austin and Lary, three horses, the remainder of all my cattle, hogs, lands, houses, and household & kitchen furniture, to her use during her natural life. — In witness whereof I have hereunto signed my name, or made my cross or mark, this 16th day of Novr. 1828.

1st Improvis, I bequeath to Joseph Jones, and my son James Samuel Withers, the following negro slaves, with their future increase, to wit, Rosina, Betty and Adam, in trust for the benefit and support of my daughter Ann E. Bowen, and her issue.

2^d Secondly, I also bequeath to Joseph Jones, and my son James Samuel Withers, ten shares of the Planters Bank in Savannah, in trust for the benefit and support of my daughter Ann Elizabeth Bowen, and her issue.

3^d Thirdly, To my son James Samuel Withers, I give Luke, Helen, Nancy, William, Anne, Mary,
