 greeting, know ye, that I, Isaac Harrell, do hereby
 av, of the State aforesaid and County of Liberty
 and in consideration of the true, good will and
 affection, which I have and do bear towards
 my beloved wife Sarah Harrell, have, and by
 these presents do, give unto the said Sarah Harrell
 the following property, viz certain head of stock
 cattle, with their increase, until my decease, three
 head of stock hogs, all my household and kitchen
 furniture, all my working tools, consisting of
 plow, harrow, shearer's knives and plantation tools
 I buy horse, 1 black mare, and saddle, all now in
 my possession, and to come unto the immediate posses-
 sion of the said Sarah Harrell at my decease, to
 have and to hold the property aforesaid absolutely
 without any manner of condition whatever, at the
 same time hereby declaring any other deeds, gift
 or will heretofore made for the giving, alien-
 or bequeathing of the aforesaid property to be void
 and illegally obtained, and of no effect whatsoever.

 hand and fixed my seal this twenty first day
 of March eighteen hundred and twelve.

 and memory, calling to mind the uncertainty of life
 and the certainty of death, do think proper to make
 and ratify this my last will and testament -
 First, I recommend my soul to Almighty God, who
 gave it, my body to be decently buried in hopes of a
 resurrection to eternal life, through Jesus Christ, my
 Lord and Saviour. And with respect to the prop-
 erty with which God has been pleased to bless me in this
 world, I dispose of it in the following manner.
 First of all, I desire that all my just debts and
 funeral expenses be paid. Then, I bequeath to any
 survivor of my estate, I desire that the sum of four
 hundred and fifty dollars be reserved for the pur-
 pose of purchasing land for my daughter in law,
 Lydia Mallard, and her children by her late hus-
 band, John Mallard, for the use, benefit and be-
 nefit of the said Lydia Mallard, and her said
 children, and her and their heirs forever. Then,
 I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Sarah
 Harrell, my negro boy Ben and good horse, my boy
 John Trip, chair and harness, my watch, and all
